DESIGN FOR A RUG.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,639, dated April 20, 1886.

Application filed March 11, 1886. Serial No. 194,905. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PETZOLD, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Rugs, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

10 In the illustration, A is an outer ground surrounding an inclosed figure or parallelogram, B, the latter having a panel, C, at each end. The figure B is surrounded or defined by a chain-border, D. Immediately upon the

15 are the figures E, in the general shape of Greek crosses. The center of figure B is ornamented with a large central rose-shaped figure, G, large flower H, and clusters of

20 leaves I and flowers K. The end panels, C C,

are ornamented by figures in the form of grape-vine leaves, L, each surmounted by a crown.

The essential features of my design are the central right-angled figure B, having end 25 panels, C C, ornamented as described, central rose-shaped flower, G, and large flower H, both surrounded by clusters of leaves I and flowers K.

What I claim as new is—

A design for rugs, consisting of a central 30 rectangular figure, B, having end plates, C C, ornamented as described, central rose-shaped flower G, large flower H, both surrounded by clusters of leaves I and flowers K, substan- 35 tially as described and shown.
