MAN'S SOCK

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Raymond A. Torgersen, a citizen of the United States, resident of Burlington, county of Alamance, State of North Carolina, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Man's Sock, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a side elevational view of a man's sock, showing my new design;

Figure 2 is an enlarged fragmentary view of the leg portion of the man's sock, shown in Figure 1.

The design is characterized by a pair of spaced relatively wide fence-worm bands encircling the leg of the sock and occupying a major portion of the leg portion of the sock between the welt and the heel, said bands having their edges of irregular and jagged outline, as shown.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a man's sock, substantially as shown and described.
