To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY A. HOFFMAN, a citizen of the United States of America, and a resident of West New York, Guttenberg, in the county of Hudson, State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Textile Fabrics, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

The figure is a plan view of a portion of the fabric, showing my new design.

In the drawing A. A. represent large feathery shaped leaves, one at the top and

the other at the lower edge of the design; B. B. are double flowers each with a center of eight berry like points. The outer petals of the flowers are nine in number and five leaves C. C. surround the berry like center. The flowers and leaves are placed on a watered background.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a textile fabric as shown and described.
