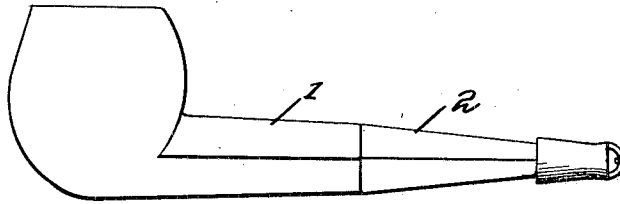

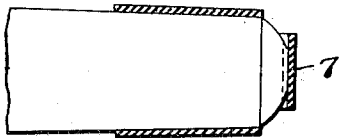

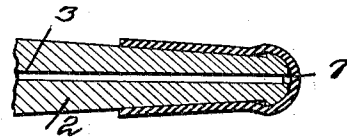

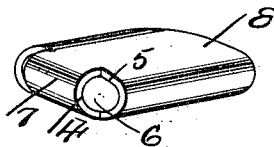
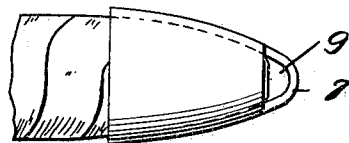

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ATTACHMENT FOR PIPES.

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To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER MARR, a citizen of the United States, residing at Westerly, in the county of Washington and State of Rhode Island, have invented new and useful Improvements in Attachments for Pipes, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to improvements in an attachment for the mouth pieces of pipes and cigar tips.

One object is to provide such a device for this purpose as may be cheaply manufactured and easily applied to a pipe or cigar.

Another object of the invention is to provide an attachment for a mouth piece which will protect the tongue and throat from a direct passage of smoke directing the smoke toward the side of the mouth.

These and other objects may be secured by the construction shown in the accompanying drawings, in which,

Figure 1 is a side elevation of a tobacco pipe showing my device applied. Fig. 2 is a plan view partly broken away of the tip of the mouth piece, the invention being shown in section. Fig. 3 is a vertical section partly broken away of the tip end of the mouth piece of the pipe. Fig. 4 is a perspective view of the device detached. Fig. 5 is an elevation of one end of the cigar, showing the device applied thereto.

Referring more particularly to the drawings, 1 represents a pipe having the usual bit 2, in which is provided the usual smoke passage 3. On the rear end of the bit is applied my device.

My device is composed of a piece of rubber of approximately tubular form being cut vertically, transversely and longitudinally as at 4 and 5 to provide an opening 6 and a web portion 7.

When applied to the mouth piece of the pipe, the body portion 8 is slipped over the end thereof having the web portion 7 stand-

ing in a vertical position and partly covering the opening 3 at the mouth end of the bit. The smoke drawn through the passage 3 will strike the web 7 and be directed laterally against the sides of the mouth.

The device is preferably formed of rubber, but any suitable material may be used. The web portion 7 is of such width as to extend to a slight degree on either end of the outlet passage 3 to insure the smoke passing laterally.

As shown in Fig. 5, the device is applied to a cigar forming a protecting mouth piece and also a guard for the tongue. In applying the device to a cigar the end is clipped off and the device then applied, a slight space, as shown, will be formed between the end of the cigar and the web portion 7.

From the foregoing it will be seen that I have provided a cheap and simple device, and one which may be readily applied to either a pipe or a cigar and which will fully protect the tongue and throat from the direct impact of the hot smoke.

Having thus described the invention what I claim as new, is:—

An attachment for a pipe comprising a hollow body adapted to be slipped on the mouthpiece of the pipe, and a web portion extending vertically across one end of the body, said web portion engaging the end of the mouthpiece and projecting laterally beyond the opening in the mouthpiece and on opposite sides thereof, said body being also provided with smoke outlets letting out therefrom in a diametrical line across the opening in the mouthpiece of the pipe.
