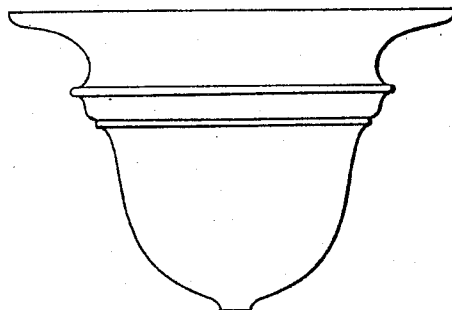

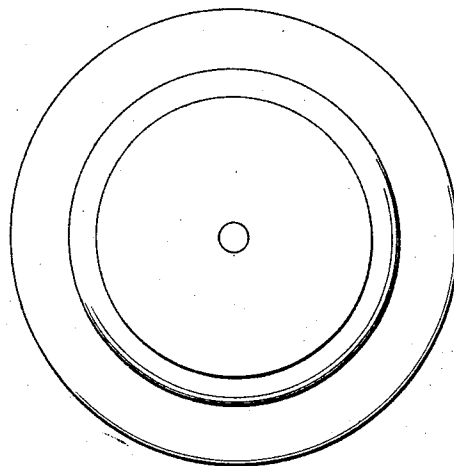

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HERMAN PLAUT, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of the borough of Manhattan, city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Artificial Light-Shade, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, in which—
