

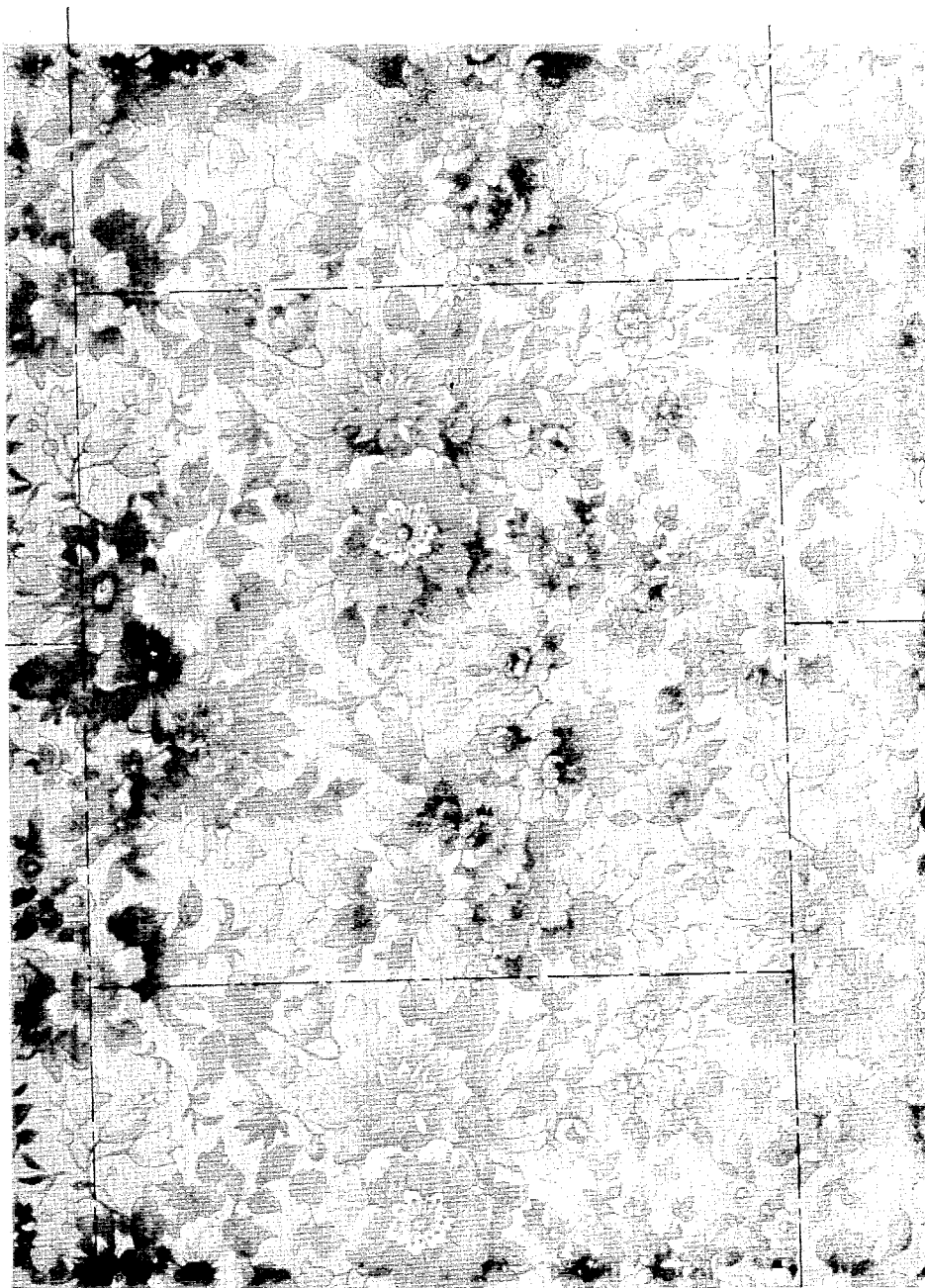

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James Plant, a subject of the King of Great Britain, residing at Eccleshall, Staffordshire, England, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Transfer Material or the like, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure is a face view of a transfer material or the like, showing my new design.

A design unit is outlined by broken lines and is repeated over the material as indicated.
