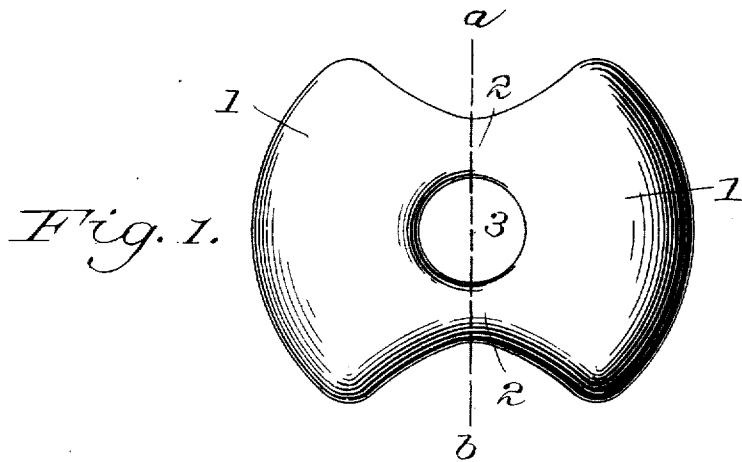

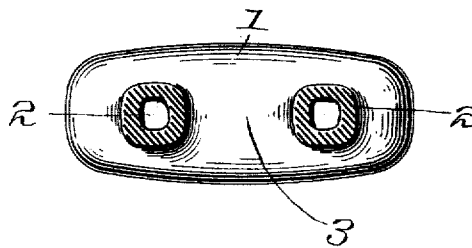

## DESIGN FOR A CUSHION.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,903, dated June 21, 1898.

Application filed March 1, 1898. Serial No. 672,102. Term of patent 14 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WILLIAM N. AMORY, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city, county, and State of New York, have invented and produced a certain new, useful, and original shape or configuration constituting a Design for a Cushion, of which the following is a specification.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 shows a cushion in plan, so as to exhibit the peculiar conformation which is essential to my invention; and Fig. 2 is a cross-section on the line *a b* of Fig. 1.

The leading or material feature of my improved design lies in the two bulbs 1, connected by the narrower portions 2 on each side of a central aperture 3.

What I claim is—

The design for a cushion substantially as shown and described.
