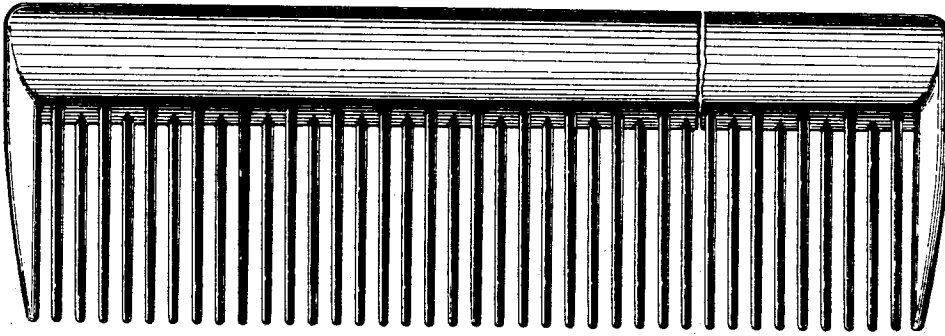

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM W. WEITLING, a citizen of the United States of America, and a resident of College Point, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Comb, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a front elevation of a comb embodying my design, and Fig. 2 is a cross-section taken on the line $x-x$ of Fig. 1.
