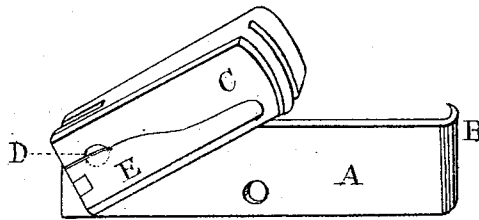

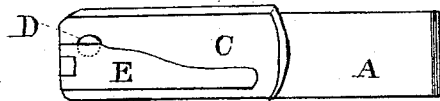

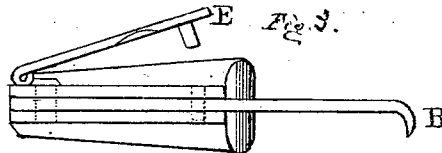
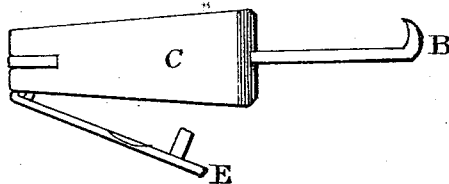

GEORGE BURT, OF DENVER, COLORADO TERRITORY.

IMPROVEMENT IN DOOR-CHECKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **162,217**, dated April 20, 1875; application filed March 13, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE BURT, of Denver, in the county of Arapahoe, in the Territory of Colorado, have invented certain Improvements in Door-Fasteners, of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to securely fasten chamber or other doors upon the inside by attaching the pocket door-fastener herein described, and which is made of brass or other metal, to the jamb and edge of the door; and it consists in a novel construction and arrangement of parts, as will be hereinafter more fully described, and then pointed out in the claim.

Figure 1 is a plan view, showing the hook-end plate partly out of the jaws; and Figs. 2, 3, and 4 are detail views in various positions.

In the accompanying drawing, A represents a plate, terminating at one end in the curved hook B. This plate works upon the rivet D in the slitted jaw C. This jaw is made so as to present a surface or shoulder broad enough

to catch and hold the door upon either side. Attached to it is a hinged bolt, E, opening outward, but which, when closed, goes through an orifice in the jaw and in the plate, so as to fasten the plate securely in its place, which, as will be seen, is especially necessary when placed upon a door opening from right to left, the jaw not then being retained in its place by its own weight, and makes it more firm and secure when placed upon a door opening from left to right.

I claim as my invention—

The hinged bolt E, in combination with and passing through the jaw C and the plate A, which plate works upon the rivet D, and terminates in a curved hook, B, all substantially as described and shown, for the purposes hereinbefore set forth.
