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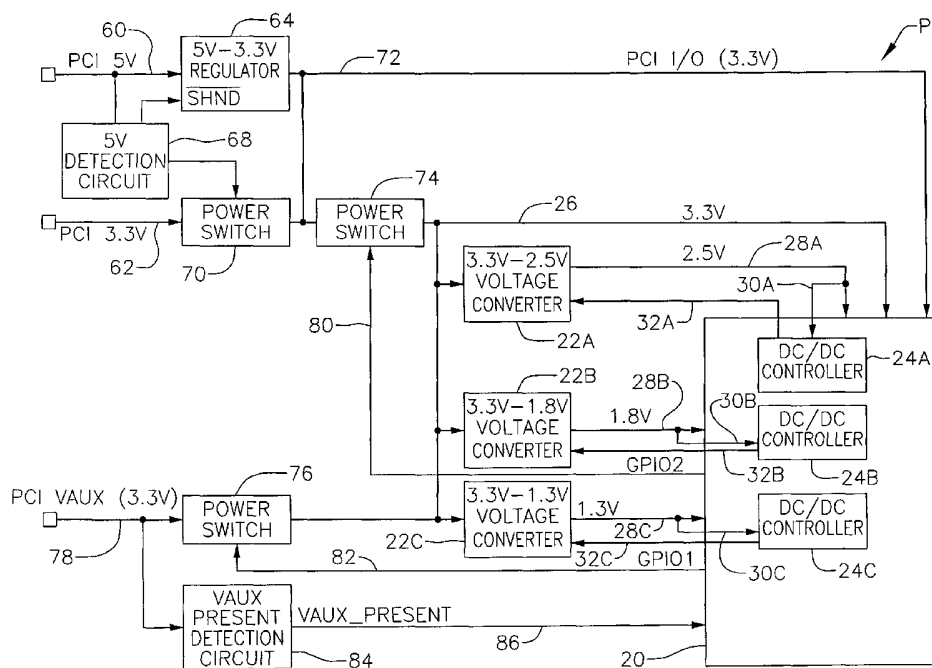

(54) Title: POWER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AND METHOD



(57) Abstract: The voltage regulator has several voltage converters (22A-22C) that output voltage signal. An integrated circuit (20) has several voltage converter controllers (24A-24C) that transmit control signals to control the voltage converter based on the output voltage signal.
