

CHARLES PINDER, OF LOWELL, MASSACHUSETTS.

IMPROVED EGG-BEATER.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 58, 382, dated October 16, 1866.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES PINDER, of Lowell, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and Improved Egg-Beater; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

The drawing is a central longitudinal sec-

tion of my invention.

My invention consists in providing a cover which fits tightly into a metallic case, which latter is the receptacle for the unbeaten eggs, with a number of hoops or arms extending downward into the case, and crossed or united, so as to retain their proper position. By shaking to and fro this device the eggs will be dashed against the hoops or arms and thoroughly reduced to a froth in a very short time.

A designates the metallic case, which, in the present instance, is cylindrical in form, that being a convenient form for handling. B is the cover or lid. This fits tightly into the case A, and it is provided with a bale, a, not only for drawing it from the case, but for passing the fingers through, so as to more readily

hold the device while shaking it.

A number of hoops or strips, C C, are secured to the lid B. In the present instance there are two, each being connected to the lid at both ends, so as to cross at right angles to each other at their lowest point. There may be more than two of these loops or strips C C, if desired, and they may be arranged somewhat differently.

In using the device the eggs are broken, and the yolks or whites, or both, as the case may require, are put into the case A, and the lid crowded on. Now, by merely shaking the device to and fro with the hand the eggs are caused to dash against the hoops or strips C C, and they are thus beaten to a froth in a very short time and with very little labor.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is-

The combination, with the case A and cover B, of the hoops or strips C C, (two or more,) the latter so arranged as to accomplish the purposes herein specified.
