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(57) **CLAIM**

I claim the ornamental design for an indoor electrical wall outlet cover, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

A new design for an indoor electrical wall outlet cover with an electrically functional cord is described in the following specification. The design is thin enough to avoid adding bulk to the outlet, thereby enabling furniture to effectively be positioned against the wall, while also effectively covering the outlet so as to act as a child safety device while still allowing ready access to the electrical connection that the outlet affords.

FIG. 1 is a perspective back view of an indoor electrical wall outlet cover of my new design;

FIG. 2 is a back view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a front view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right side view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a left side view thereof;

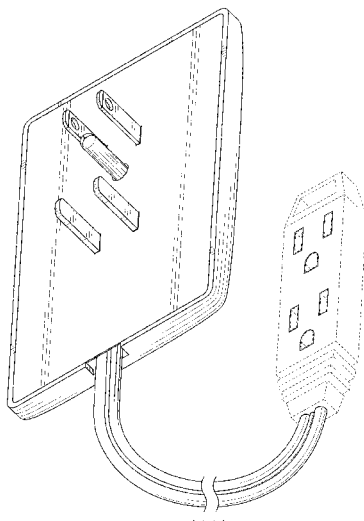
FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof; and,

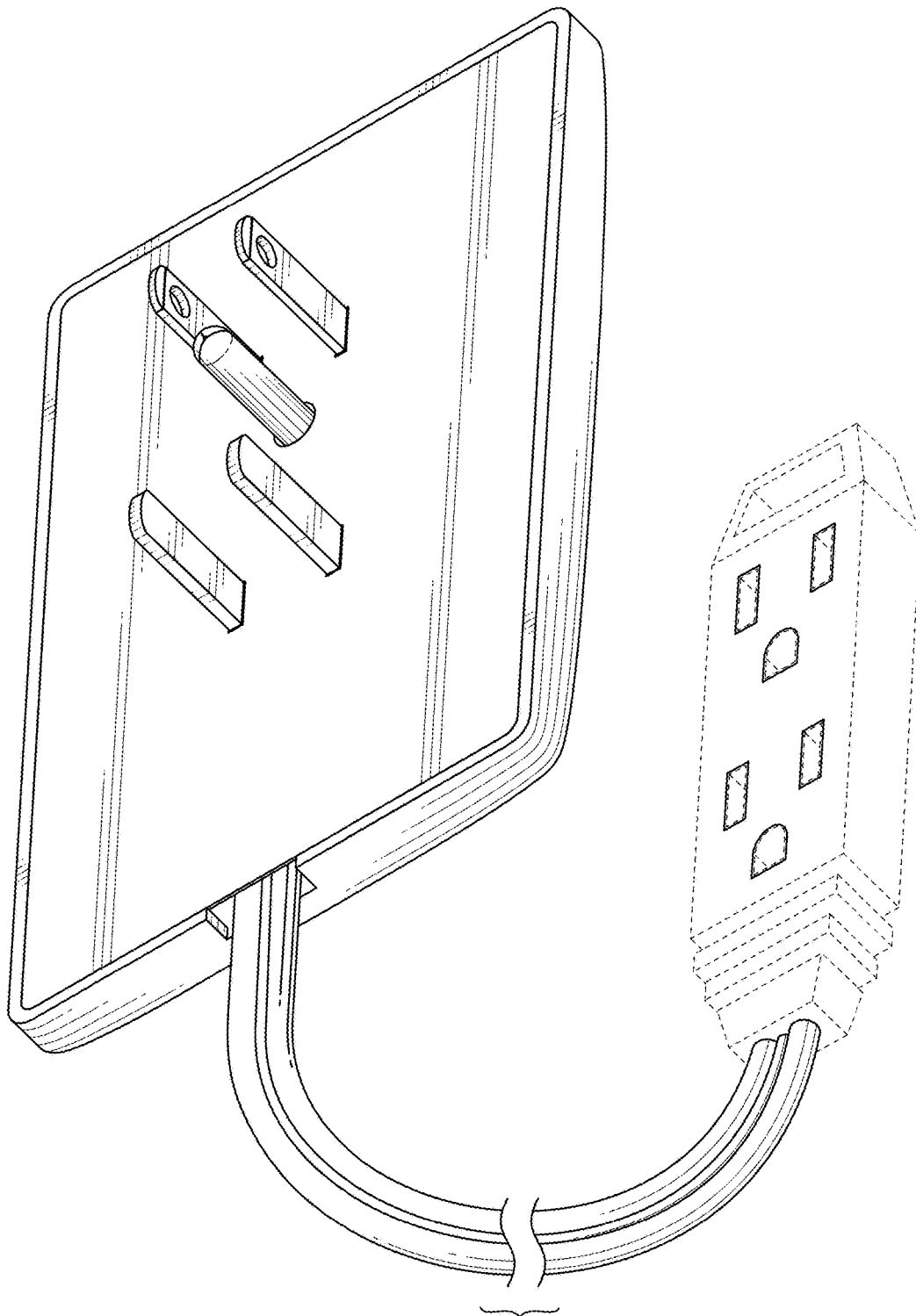

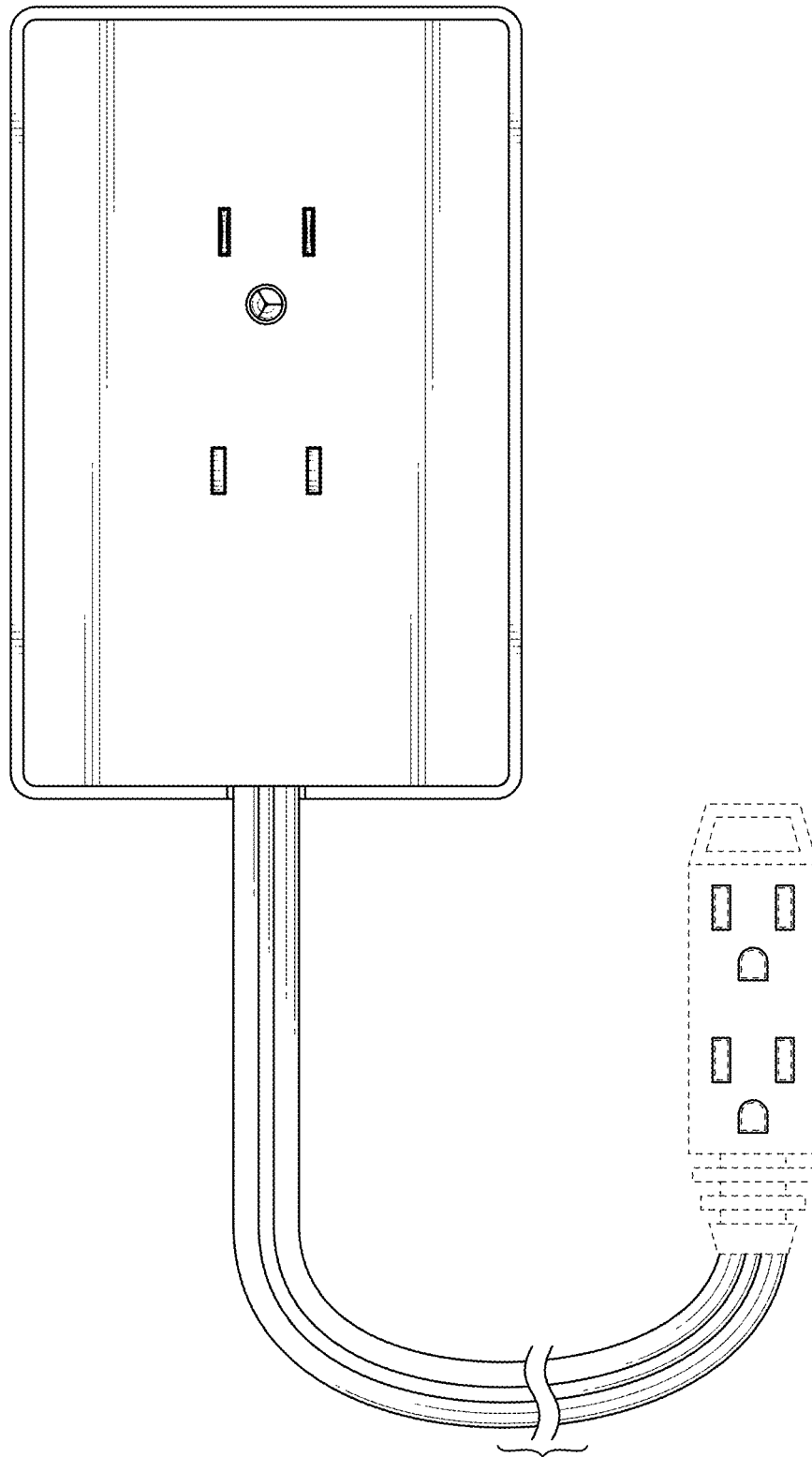

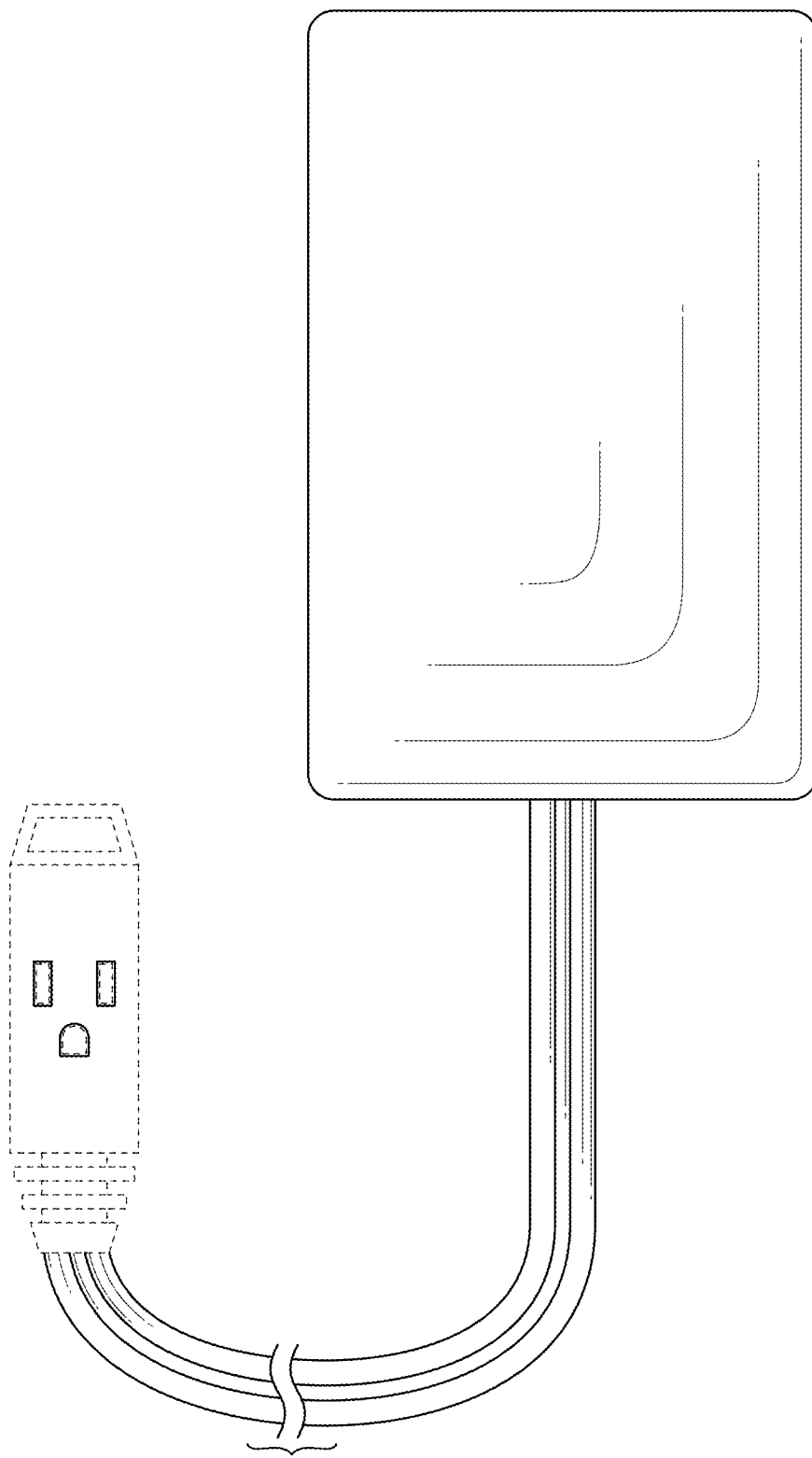

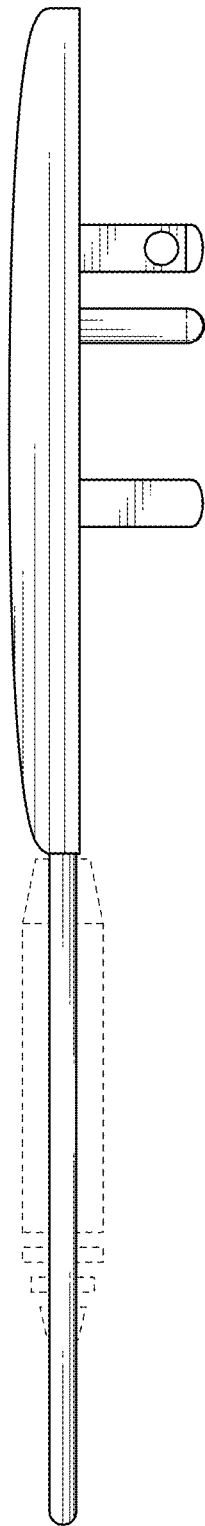

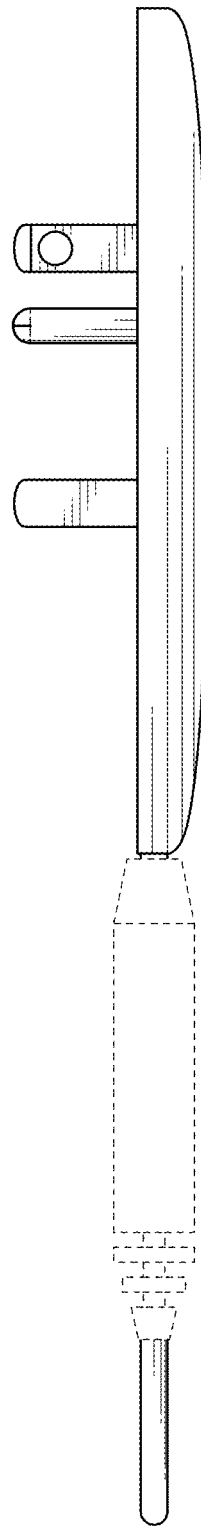

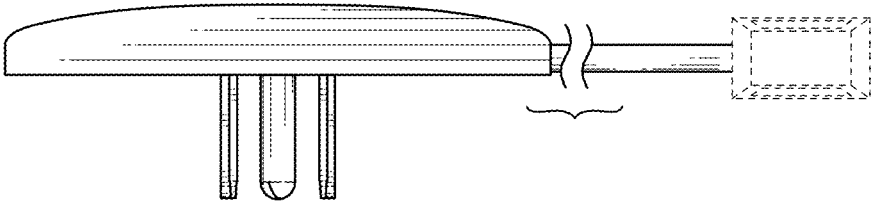

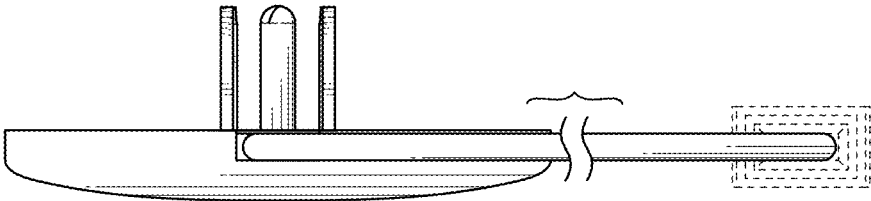
