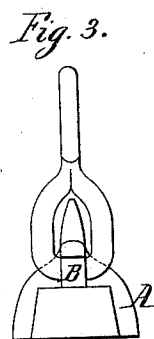
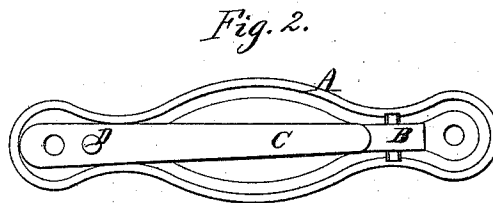
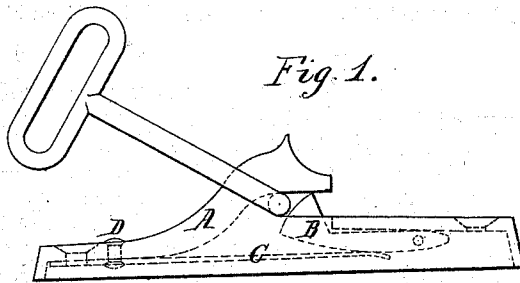

IMPROVEMENT IN HOLDBACKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 124,888, dated March 26, 1872.

SPECIFICATION.

I, GEORGE FREDERICK DE VINE, of the city of Hamilton, Province of Ontario, Canada, have invented an Improvement in a Carriage-Holdback, of which the following is a specification:

My invention is that peculiar-shaped stock shown in the drawing in connection with a lever and spring.

Figure 1 is a side view of my invention. Fig. 2 is a bottom view. Fig. 3 is an end view.

A is the stock or body of the holdback. B is the lever or latch. C is the spring. D is the rivet in spring.

I claim as my invention—

The holdback, having that peculiar-shaped stock or shell, the lever or latch, and a spring bearing on the bottom of same, as described.
