DESIGN FOR TABLE-CASTER HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 7,110, dated January 13, 1874; application filed December 27, 1873. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORACE C. WILCOX, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Handle of Table-Casters; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents a front view.

This invention relates to a design for the handle of table-casters, and particularly to that class which are of loop form; and it consists in a diagonal bar across the loop, as shown in the accompanying illustration and hereinafter described. A is the socket by which the handle is secured to the caster; B, the handle, of loop form, its particular configuration or ornamentation not being essential to this design. Across the loop, from one side to the other, a bar, C, is placed in a diagonal position, as shown in the illustration. This diagonal bar across the loop is the distinguishing characteristic of this design.

I claim as my invention-

The design for caster-handle, consisting of the diagonal bar C across the loop from side to side, substantially as shown in the accompanying illustration, and as herein described. HORACE C. WILCOX.
