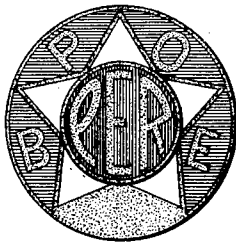

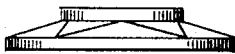

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, LOUIS COHN, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of New York, borough of Manhattan, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a certain new, original, and ornamental Design for Buttons, Badges, or Similar Articles, of which the following is a specification.
