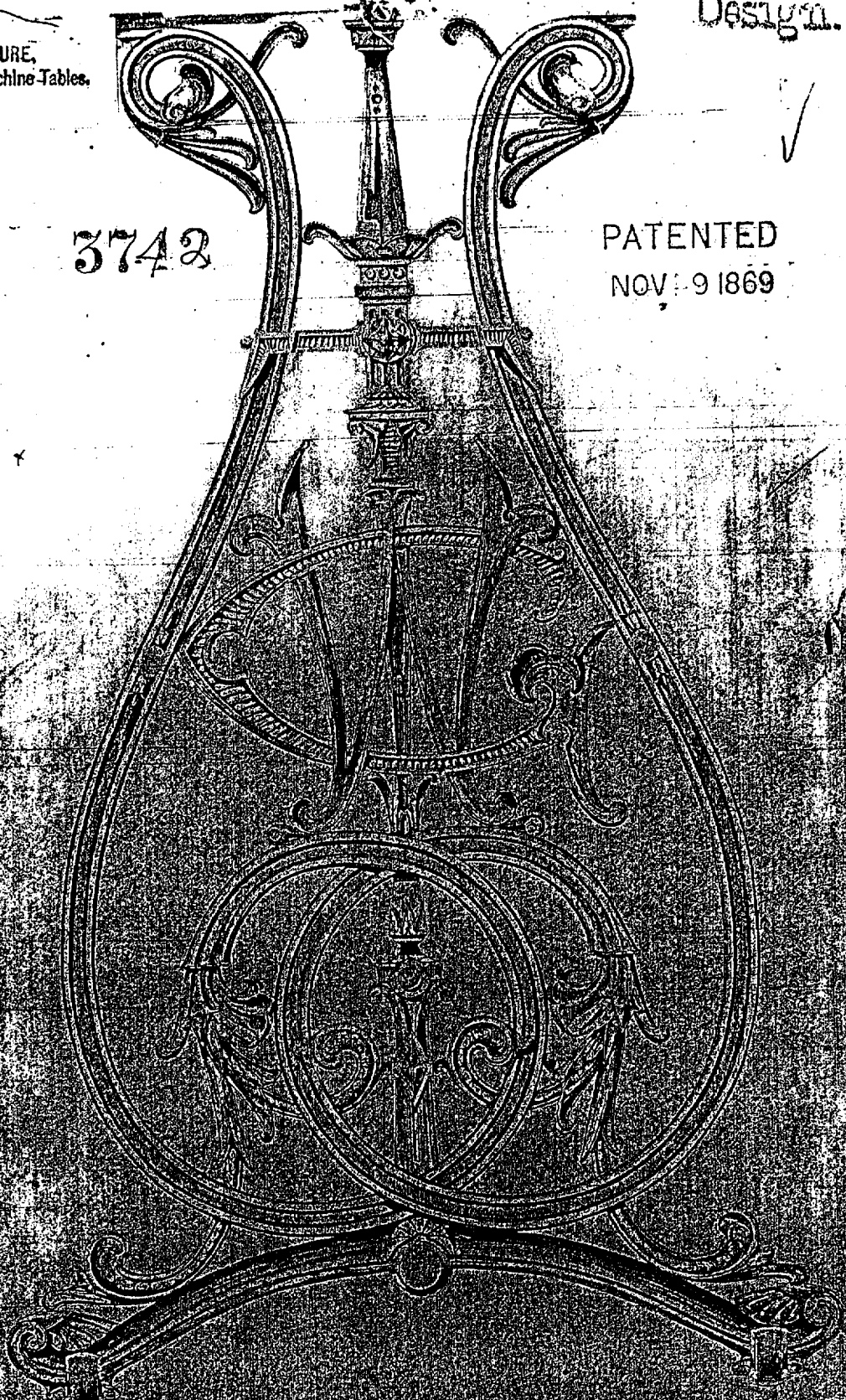

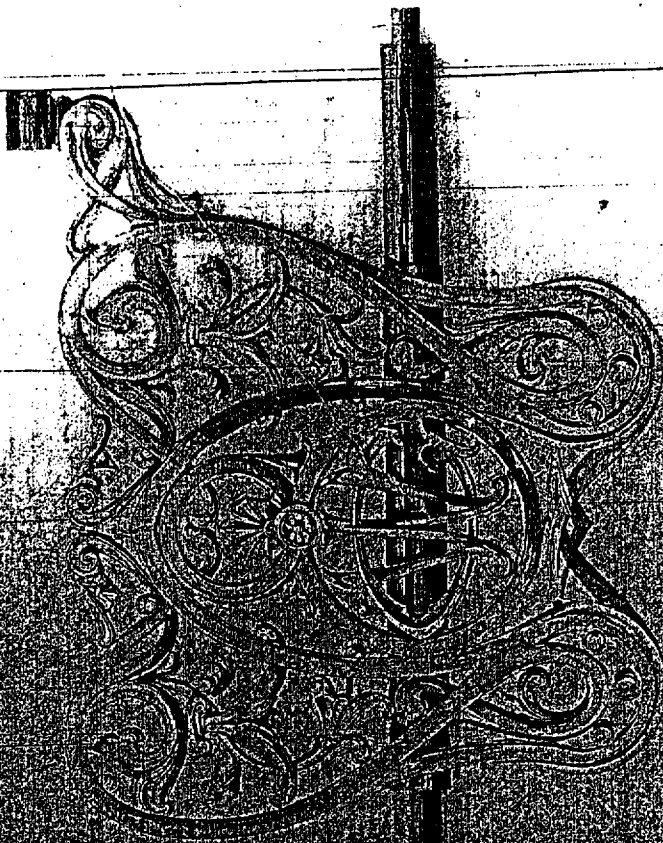

DESIGN FOR THE LEG AND TREADLE OF A SEWING-MACHINE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES GREIFF, of New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Leg and Treadle, forming part of a Sewing-Machine Stand, of which the following is a specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, to which reference is made.

Sheet 1 is the leg of the stand, and sheet 2, the

treadle. In each, the monogram "W. G." is arranged, and surrounded by ornamentation as represented.

What I claim as my invention, is—

The design for leg and treadle, forming part of a sewing-machine stand, as herein shown.
