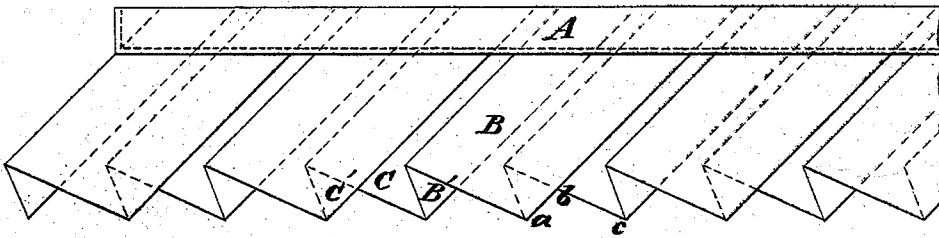

IMPROVEMENT IN TRIMMINGS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **137,344**, dated April 1, 1873; application filed
January 20, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ORANGE M. CHAMBERLAIN, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new Article of Manufacture in Plaiting; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification.

The nature of my invention relates to a new article of manufacture; and consists of a bias box-plait, formed of a single or double piece of cloth, either with a heading or binding, or without it, and is formed by making the ordinary box-plait at an angle to the edge of the cloth, instead of in line with it, as is the case with the ordinary box-plait.

Figure 1 is a plan view of a bias box-plait,

in which A is a heading or binding, which may be applied or not. B is the upper part of a bias box-plait, and C is the bottom part of a bias box-plait. B' is the under side of the upper part, and C' is the under side of the bottom part, the angle *a b c* forming a bias, making a bias box-plait.

I have now fully described my invention and the manner of making it, and

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

As a new article of manufacture, the trimming herein described, formed of bias box-plaits, substantially as shown, and for the purpose set forth.
