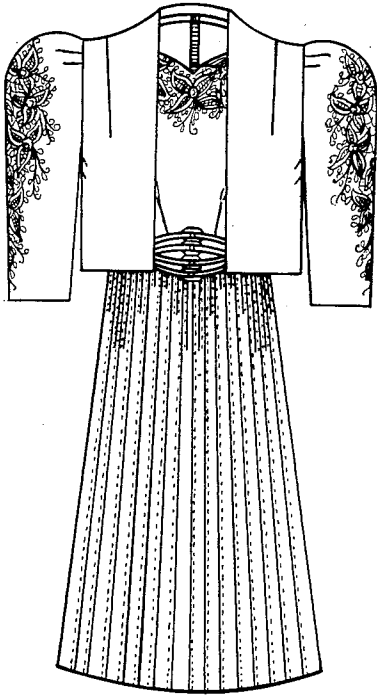

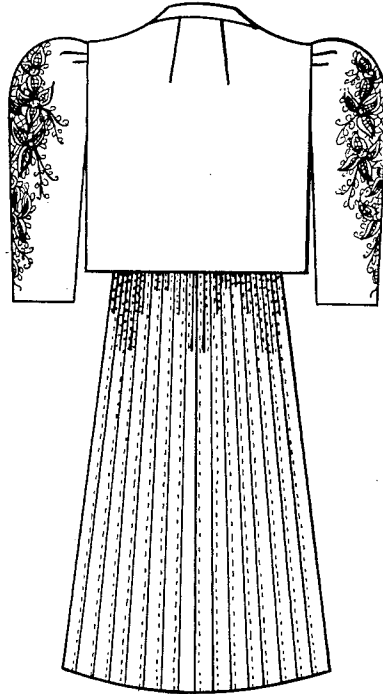

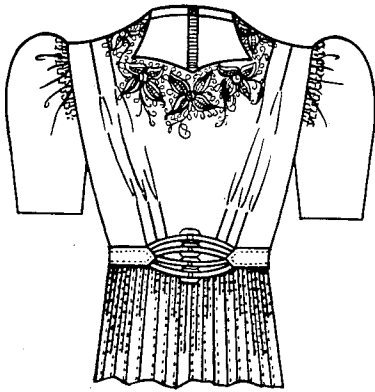

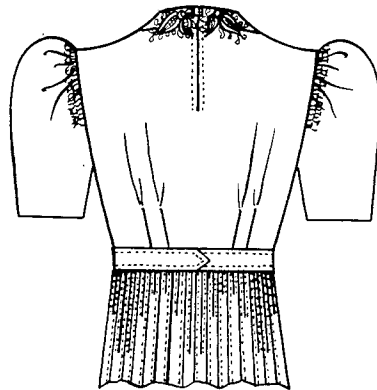

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Philip Heit, a citizen of the United States of America, residing in the city of New York, county of New York, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Dress Ensemble, of which the following is a specification reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
