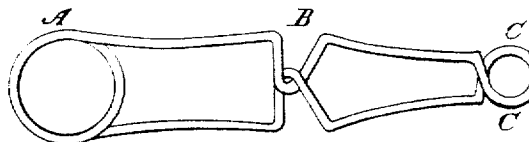

DESIGN FOR CIGAR AND CIGARETTE HOLDER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 11,877, dated July 20, 1880.

Application filed May 27, 1880. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PEDRO KURCZYN, a subject of Great Britain, residing in the city, county, and State of New York, have invented
5 and produced a new and original Design for Cigar and Cigarette Holders, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

10 Heretofore holders for cigars and cigarettes have been made of wire; but none of which have been so shaped as to produce characteristic symbols.

15 The leading feature of my design consists in the formation of three letters, O K C, by the bending and entwining of a single piece of wire in the production of a holder for cigars and cigarettes, the said initial letters denoting the particular brand of goods which the same
20 are intended to advertise, which is the "O. K. Cigarette," or "O. K. Cigar."

The coil A represents the letter O; the interlocking at the center, B, represents the letter K; the crossing of the semicircular extremities forming the jaws C C represents
25 the letter C, the whole having the combined effect of representing the "O. K. C. holder."

It is to be understood that only the configuration herein shown is covered by this case, as an application for a patent on the mechanical structure of the device is now pending.

What I claim as new is—

The design for a cigarette-holder herein described, forming the letters O K C by the wire being coiled into a circle at A, bent into crossed
35 upright at B, and cross and circle at C.
