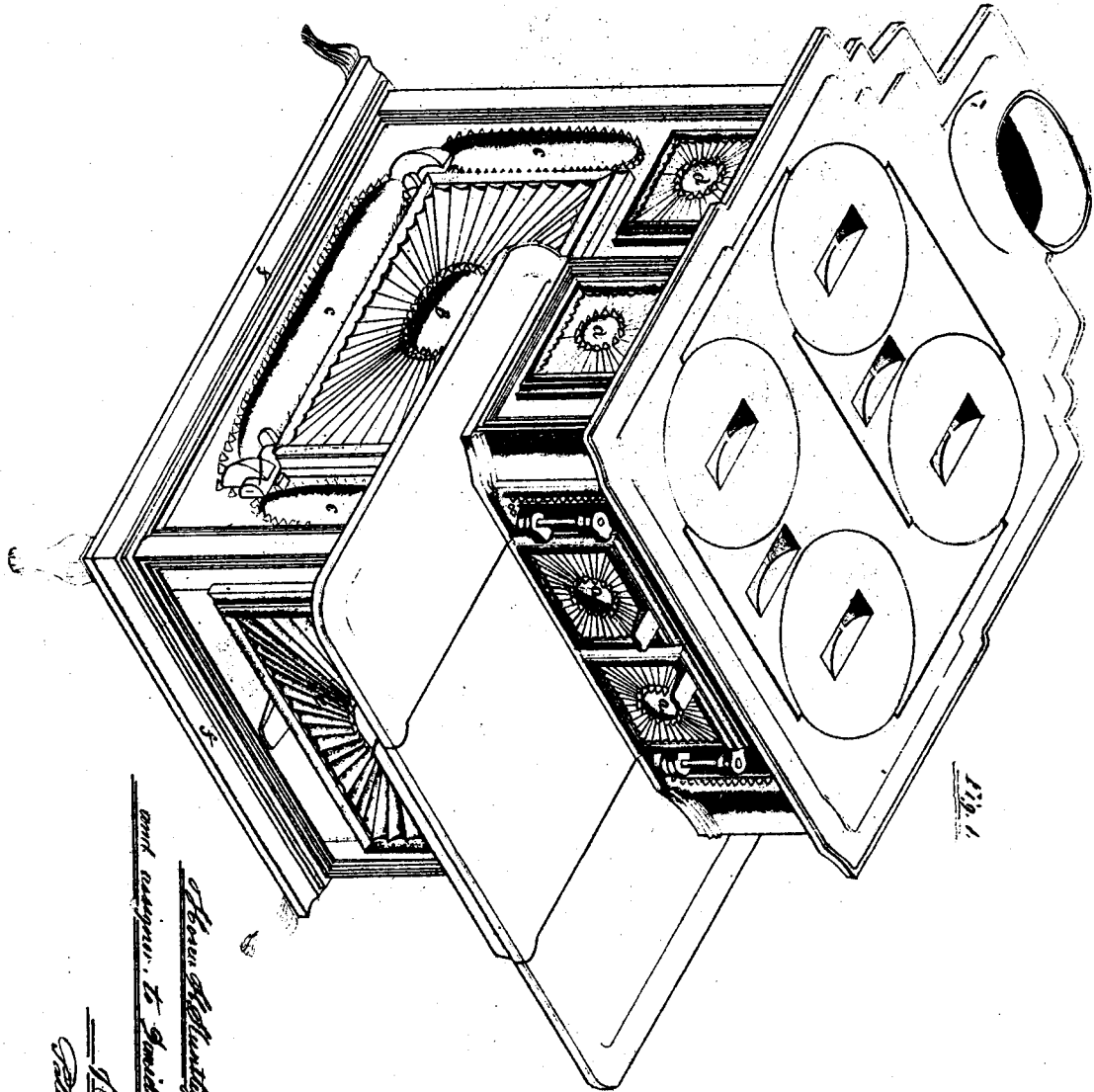

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Hosea H. Huntley, of the city of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton, and State of Ohio, have produced or invented a new and original design for a cooking stove designated by the name of Queen of the West Improved. and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same reference being had to the accompanying drawings and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon making part of this specification—

The accompanying drawing Fig: 1, represents a perspective view of the stove standing on its feet, showing its front—above and under the hearth—together with its side and top—

A, A, represents the doors of the front of the stove above the hearth leading to the furnace, and finished with small mouldings around their edges and ornamented with semi-circular grooves on the panels—running from their edges to the centers—the centers being finished with a semi-sphere in relief and studded with drop work around their edges as represented in the accompanying drawing—

The front plate, e, under the hearth is finished with small mouldings around its edges, and the panel is ornamented similar to the front doors a, a, the front plate also above the hearth is finished with mouldings around its edges and studded with drop work similar to the center of the doors.

The side plate of the stove is finished with mouldings around its edges—and represents a door B, attached on hinges—leading to the oven which is finished similar to the plate, e, under the hearth—C, C, C, are semi-elliptical forms in relief at the sides and bottom of the door B, studded with drop work around their edges.

D, D, are portions of the top part of the side plate finished.

similar to the front doors, a, a', with moulds grooves and drop work - f, f, represents the edge of the bottom plate ornamented with mouldings.

The ornamental parts and configurations not here specified, are fully represented in the accompanying drawing.

What I claim as my invention or production - and desire to have secured by Letters Patent - is the combination and arrangement of the ornamental forms and configurations of a cooking stove as represented in the accompanying drawings forming an ornamental design - as before described -
