INTEGRAL SINK AND VANITY TOP OR SIMILAR ARTICLE

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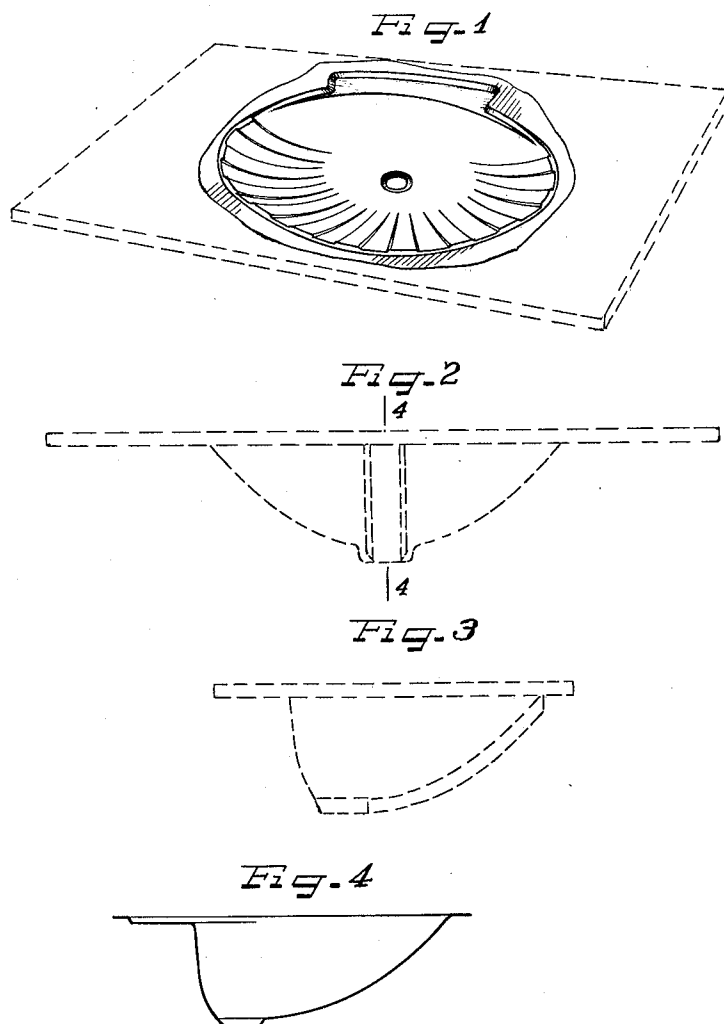


FIGURE 1 is a perspective view of an integral sink and vanity top, or similar article, showing my new design;

FIGURE 2 is a side elevation of the device shown in FIGURE 1;

FIGURE 3 is an end elevation of the device shown in FIGURES 1 and 2; and

FIGURE 4 is a profile view of the interior of the bowl and of the sink top as viewed on line IV—IV.

The dominant features of the design reside in the portions shown in full lines.
