

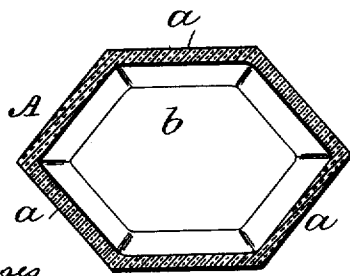
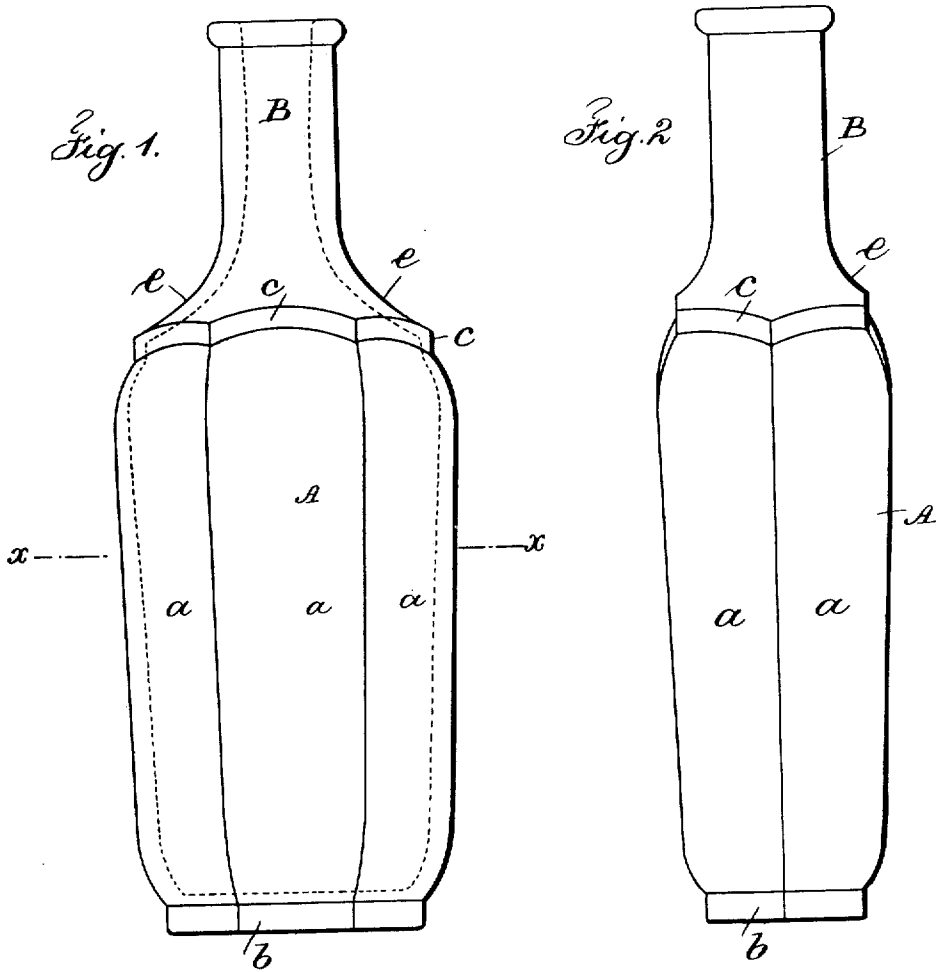

DESIGN FOR A BOTTLE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 29,127, dated August 2, 1898.

Application filed July 6, 1898. Serial No. 685,285. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER BARRIE, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Bottle, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof, in which—

10 Figure 1 is a side elevation; Fig. 2, an end elevation, and Fig. 3 a section at *xx* of Fig. 1.

15 The leading features of my design for a bottle consist of the elongated body of flattened hexagon shape in cross-section, with tapering sides rounded at the respective ends, the straight hexagonal base and hexagonal shoulders, and a flaring base to the neck. The elongated body A is sectionally a flattened

hexagon, the respective faces *a* of the hexagon being approximately flat. The faces *a* 20 and the corners or angles are tapering toward the lower end of the bottle and are rounded at their ends toward the straight hexagonal base *b*. The sides or faces *a* are rounded at their upper ends, as shown in Figs. 1 and 2, to 25 the hexagonal shoulders *c*. The neck B is made with approximately parallel sides flaring at *e* to the hexagonal shoulders *c*.

What I claim is—

The design for a bottle, substantially as 30 herein shown and described.
