(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a portion of a shoe upper, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a first front perspective view of a portion of a shoe upper showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a second front perspective view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a rear perspective view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a first side view thereof;


FIG. 5 is a second side view thereof;














