



To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY L. WALLACE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Wallingford, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Spoon, Fork, or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a face view of a spoon, fork or similar article showing my new design. Fig. 2 is a detail perspective view.
