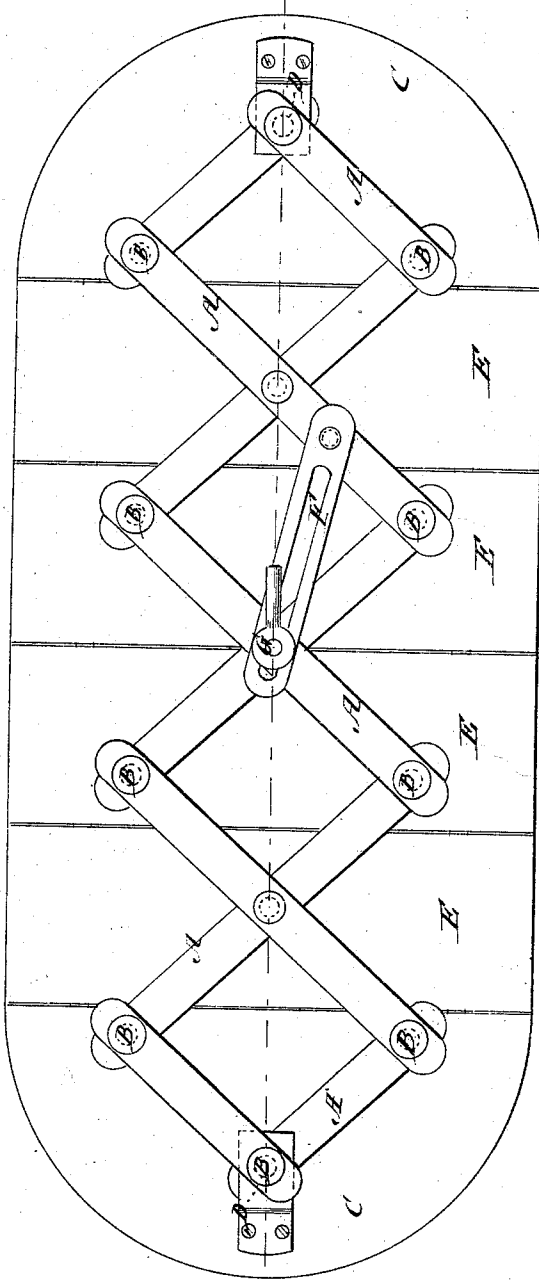
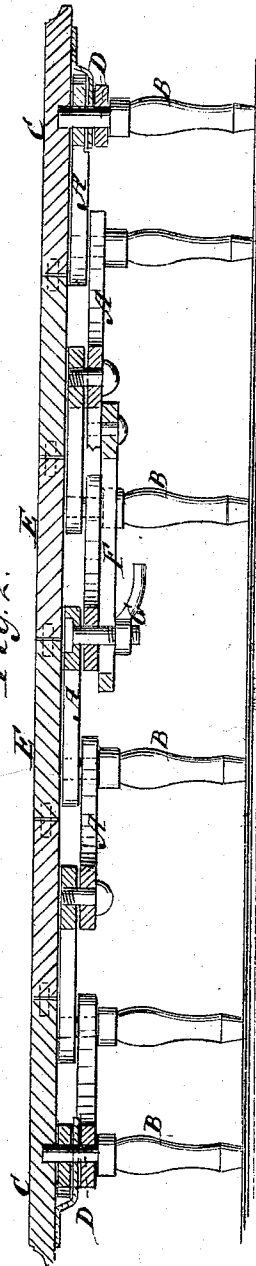

IMPROVEMENT IN EXTENSION-TABLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **169,997**, dated November 16, 1875; application filed October 8, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, ANSEL D. JONES and SAMUEL L. JONES, of Kirksville, in the county of Madison and State of Kentucky, have invented a new and Improved Extension-Table, of which the following is a specification:

The invention will first be described in connection with drawing, and then pointed out in the claim.

Figure 1 is a plan of the under side of a table contrived according to our invention; and Fig. 2 is a longitudinal section of the same, taken on the line *x x*.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A represents the bars or links of the lazy-tongs frame; B, legs to the same; C, end pieces of the table-top, connected to ends of frame at D; E, removable parts of the table;

F, slotted bar, and G clamp-screw, forming an adjustable clamp for fastening the frame at any degree of extension.

The frame can be constructed in this form much cheaper than in the ordinary tongued and grooved sliding sections, and it is easier to adjust.

Having thus described our invention, we claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The combination, with lazy-tongs A A, pivoted to ends C C, of the centrally-placed clamp G and slotted bar F, as and for the purpose specified.
