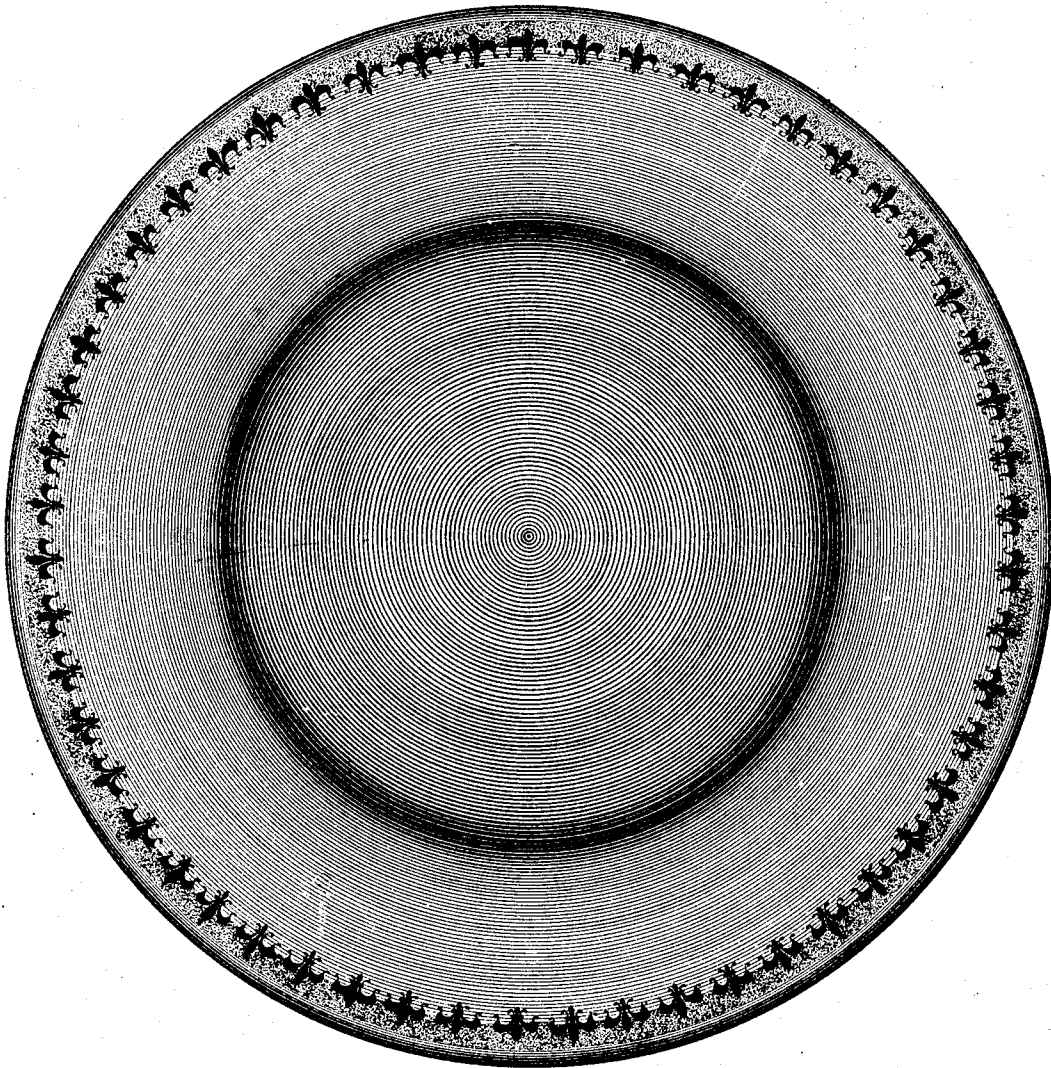

DESIGN FOR A PLATE OR SIMILAR ARTICLE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 37,202, dated November 1, 1904.

Application filed September 28, 1904. Serial No. 226,375. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JACOB WILLIAMSON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Plate or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
