








## DESIGN FOR AN ACCORDION

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, John Vassos, a citizen of the United States, residing at New Canaan, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Accordion, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

In the drawings:

Fig. 1 is a perspective front view of an accordion, showing my new design, the accordion being shown in semi-extended position.

Fig. 2 is a perspective side view, the accordion being shown in semi-extended position.

Fig. 3 is a perspective front view, the accordion being shown in closed position.

Fig. 4 is a perspective front view, the accordion being shown in closed position.

Fig. 5 is a perspective side view, the accordion being shown in closed position.

Fig. 6 is a perspective rear view, the accordion being shown in closed position.
