

COMBINED STOVE-DOOR AND HEARTH.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, JOHN A. PRICE, of Scranton, Luzerne county, Pennsylvania, have invented an Improved Stove-Door and Hearth combined, of which the following is a specification.

This invention consists in the combination of a stove-door with a hearth, when these two parts are either cast in one piece or otherwise rigidly connected, so as to be both supported upon the same hinges and swung open together, so as to uncover the ash-pan and fire-box at the same time, and close together, whereby the labor of removing and replacing the hearth separately is avoided.

Figure 1 is a front, and
Figure 2 a side elevation; and
Figure 3 is a plan view.
In the drawing—
a is the stove-door;

d d, the hinges by which the door is connected with the stove;

b, the hearth, rigidly attached at its inner side to the lower edge of the door;

c, the ash-pan; and

e, the stove.

Besides possessing the advantages enumerated above, this construction admits of opening the front of the stove, when it is necessary to work at the same, more fully than could otherwise be done.

I claim as my invention—

The combination of a hinged stove-door, a, and hearth b, substantially in the manner described and for the purpose set forth.
