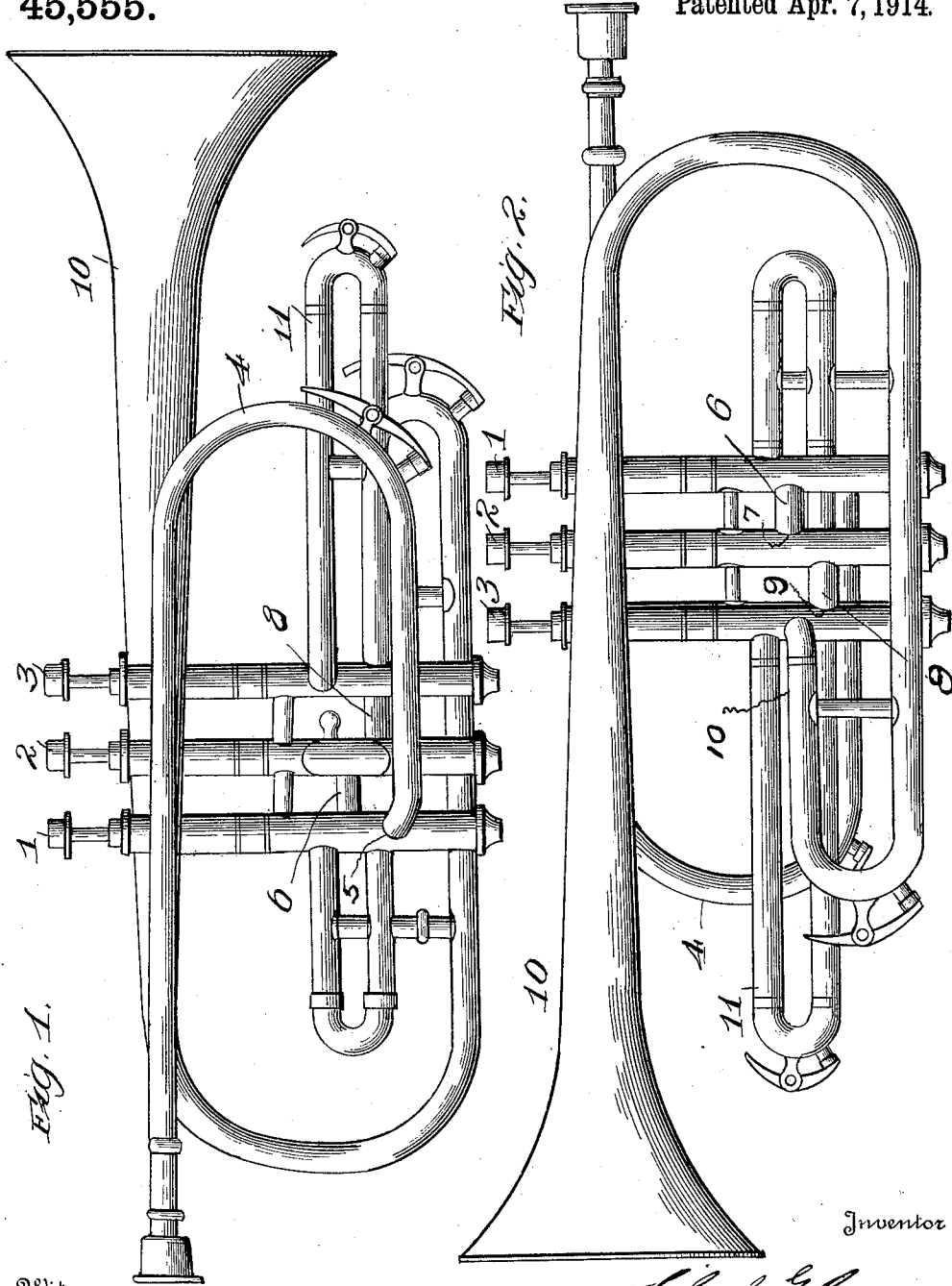

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES G. CONN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Elkhart, in the county of Elkhart and State of Indiana, have invented a certain new, original, and ornamental Design for Cornets, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a front elevation of a cornet showing my new design, and Fig. 2 is a rear elevation of a cornet showing my new design.
