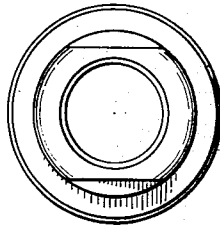

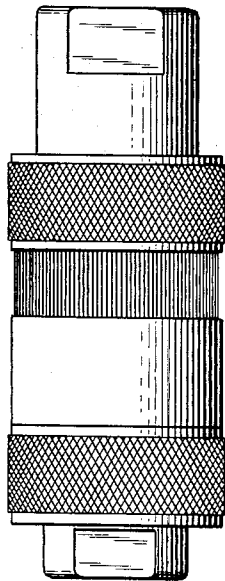

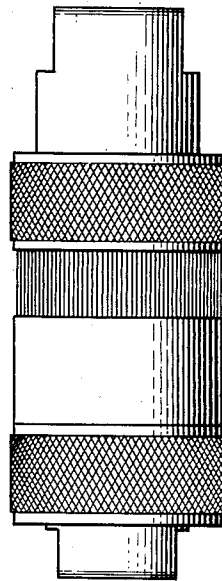

## SEPARABLE COUPLING FOR HYDRAULIC LINES

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, Raymond M. Ulrich, a citizen of the United States, residing at Roanoke, in the county of Woodford and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Separable Coupling for Hydraulic Lines, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a plan view of a separable coupling for hydraulic lines, showing my new design;

Figure 2 is a front view of the device shown in Figure 1; and

Figure 3 is a side view of the same device shown in Figures 1 and 2.
