HAIR-TONIC.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CONSTAS TSORONES, a subject of Greece, now residing at Minneapolis, in the county of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, have invented a new and useful Hair-Tonic, of which the following is a specification.

My composition consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportions stated, viz: corrosive sublimate, ten (10) grains; quinin sulfate, forty (40) grains; chloral hydrate, twenty (20) grains; tincture of rhatany, one (1) ounce; nitric acid, from three (3) to six (6) drops,—enough to dissolve the quinin sulfate; alcohol, seven (7) ounces; water, ten (10) ounces. These ingredients are to be thoroughly mingled by

agitation. This solution is to be used by applying same to the hair and scalp, rubbing same in thoroughly, and about twelve hours after the using of the solution, bathing the scalp in luke warm water, in order that the dandruff or other matter, together with the solution may be removed from the scalp.

I claim:

A hair tonic consisting of corrosive sublimate, quinin sulfate, chloral hydrate, tincture of rhatany, nitric acid, alcohol and water in the proportions stated.
