WILLIAM WILEY GARDNER, OF RUSSELLVILLE, KENTUCKY.

IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUNDS FOR CURE OF COLIC, &c.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 129,886, dated July 30, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM WILEY GARDNER, a minister of the gospel, of the town of Russellville, in the county of Logan, in the State of Kentucky, have invented and perfected a new and original Medical Compound or Formula, designed for the cure of colic, especially in infants, to be designated and known as "Gardner's Colic-Drops for Infants;" and I hereby declare that the following is a full and exact recipe of the ingredients and proportions used in said compound or formula, viz:

Calcined magnesia, two drams, apothecaries' weight; essence of cinnamon, two drams, apothecaries' weight; essence of peppermint, two drams, apothecaries' weight; fluid extract of lettuce, two drams, apothecaries' weight; tincture of camphor, two drams, apothecaries'

weight; tincture of asafetida, two drams, apothecaries' weight; sirup of rhubarb, aromatic, two drams, apothecaries' weight; pure brandy or whisky, one fluid ounce, apothecaries' measure; simple sirup, two fluid ounces, apothecaries' measure.

Dose, from ten to sixty drops, according to age and urgency.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The compound formed by combination of the above-named ingredients, substantially as specified.
