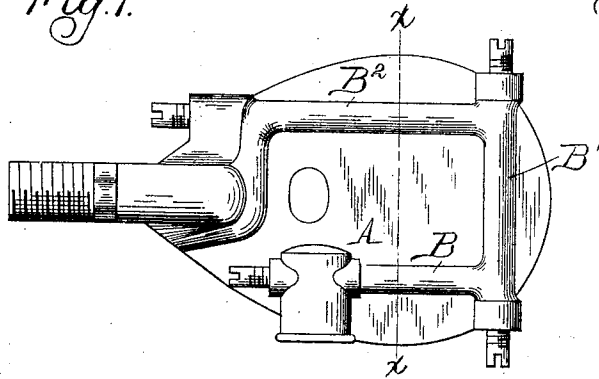

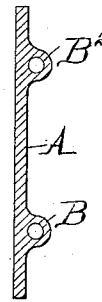
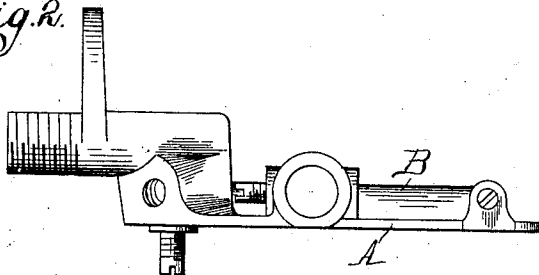

DESIGN FOR A BURNER-PLATE FOR GENERATORS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 32,257, dated February 20, 1900.

Application filed January 8, 1900. Serial No. 784. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN E. LAMBERT, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Detroit, in the county of Wayne and State of Michigan, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Burner-Plate for Generators, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof, in which—

Figure 1 is a plan view looking at the under side of the burner-plate for generators. Fig. 2 is a side view of Fig. 1. Fig. 3 is a section on line *xx*, Fig. 1.

The leading or material feature of my design consists in the peculiar configuration and outline of the generating-duct, which is

cast on the under side of the burner-plate A in the form of three intersecting ribs $BB'B^2$, disposed near the edges of the burner-plate 20 and arranged as shown in Fig. 1, the said ribs being rounded in cross-section and intersecting each other at right angles.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to obtain by Letters 25 Patent, is—

The design for a burner-plate for generators substantially as herein shown and described.
