## DESIGN FOR FUR LINING FOR CLOAKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,368**, dated August 26, 1879; application filed July 3, 1879.  
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HERMANN F. BINDSEIL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Fur Linings for Cloaks, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

Fur linings for ladies' cloaks are made up of squirrel-skins, either by using the gray portions only, or by using both the gray and white portions of the same. The latter style is the prevailing one, as the character of such a lining is less monotonous than that of a lining made of one color throughout.

The object of this invention is to enhance the effect of these fur linings with white strips still more by introducing at the upper ends of the skins, intermediately between the white stripes or portions, short tongue-shaped pieces, by which a more lively character is imparted to the lining.

In the illustration, A represents a fur lining of squirrel-skins, which are arranged in sec-

tions and connected at their white or belly portions, so that longitudinal stripes are formed between the gray portions. At the upper end of each skin is inserted a short strip or tongue, B, which improves the appearance of the lining, by rendering it brighter and more attractive, as the gray portions are broken up still more, and thereby a greater variety is given to the lining.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to protect by Letters Patent—

The design for a fur lining for cloaks, having longitudinal stripes, and shorter intermediate strips or tongues interposed between the stripes, as shown and described.
