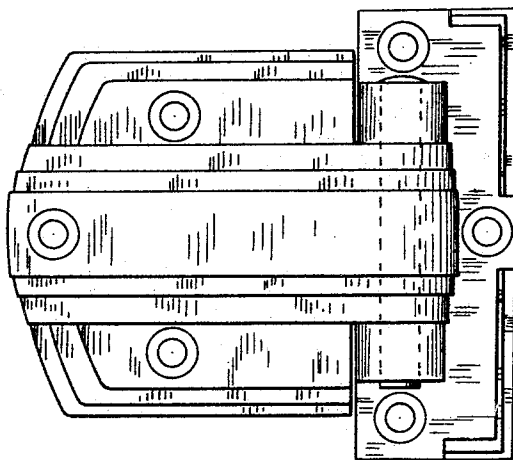

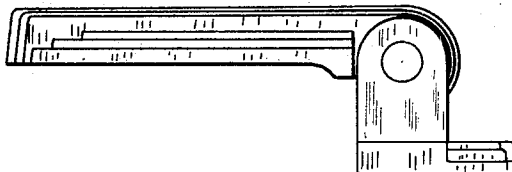

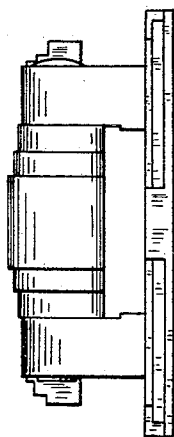

DESIGN FOR A HINGE ASSEMBLY FOR REFRIGERATORS OR THE LIKE

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE GRAFF, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Toledo, in the county of Lucas and State of Ohio, have invented a certain new, original, and ornamental Design for Hinge Assembly for Refrigerators or the like, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof, in which—

Figure 1 is a front elevation of a hinge assembly for refrigerators or the like showing my new design; Figure 2 is a side elevation thereof; Figure 3 is an end elevation thereof.
