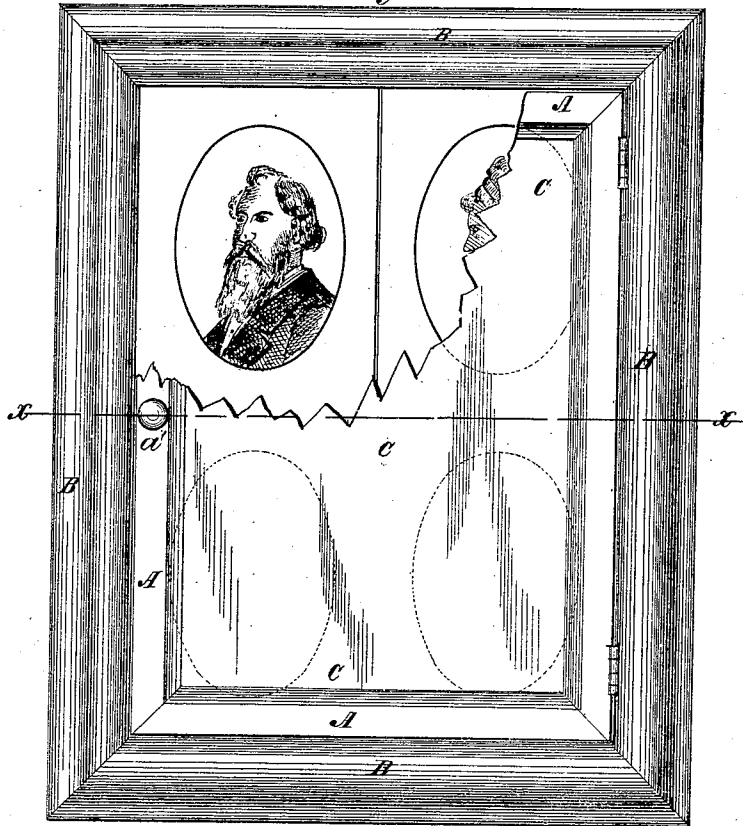
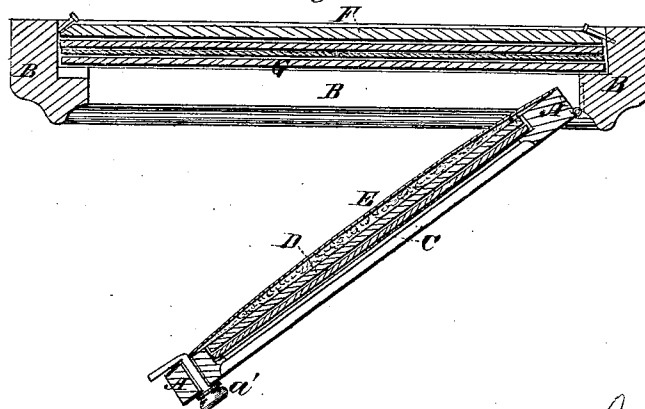

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IMPROVEMENT IN COMBINED LOOKING-GLASSES AND PHOTOGRAPHIC FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **153,283**, dated July 21, 1874; application filed April 11, 1874.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ISAAC N. SHATTO, of Newport, Perry county, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Combined Looking-Glass and Photographic Frame, of which the following is a specification:

Fig. 1 is a front view of my improved device; and Fig. 2 is a cross-section of the same, taken through the line *x x*, Fig. 1.

My invention has for its object to combine, with a looking-glass, a receptacle for photographs, family records, &c., and which shall be so constructed as to prevent them from being seen and handled, and keep them from the dust, and which may be applied to looking-glasses of any desired size.

The invention will first be fully described, and then pointed out in the claim.

A represents the inner or border frame, which is hinged to the outer or main frame B, and is provided with a catch or button, *a'*, for securing it when closed. The hinged frame

A has the glass C inserted in it, and is provided with a back, D, which is covered with velvet E, or other suitable material. The main frame B is also provided with a back, F, in the ordinary manner, and with a glass, G, between which and the back F the photographs or records are to be placed. By this construction the device, when closed, presents no appearance of being anything but an ordinary looking-glass.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A looking-glass and photograph holder, consisting of the two frames A B, the former hinged within the latter, and both recessed, the first to receive the pieces C D E, and the other the pieces F G, as shown and described.
