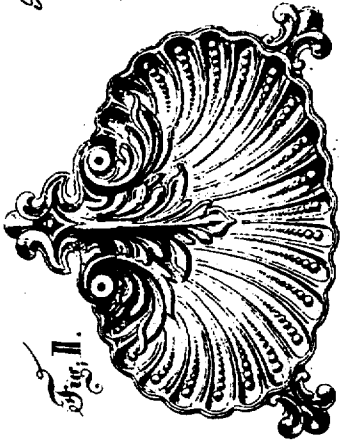

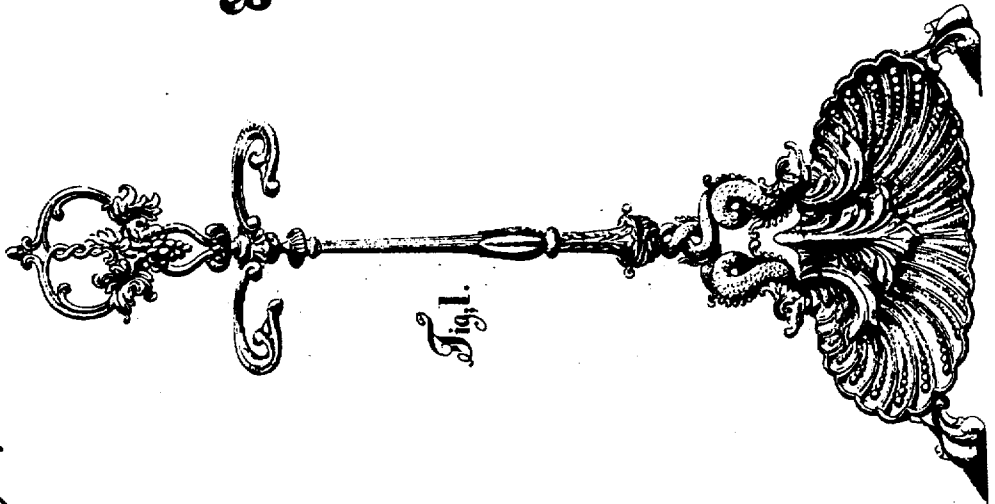

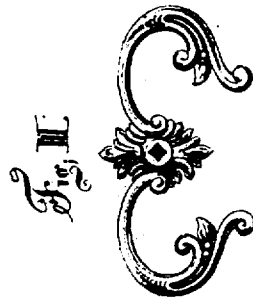

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I,
Charles Zeuner, of the city of Cincinnati, in the county
of Hamilton and state of Ohio, have invented or produced
a new & original design for a stand for shovels and Tongs, and
I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact des-
cription of the same, reference being had to the accompanying
Drawings.

The shell or dish, which forms the
base on which the shovels & Tongs are to rest, and which also
serves as a receptacle for dirt or ashes from the shovel and Tongs
represents a ribbed shell, the ribs are alternately flat and concave.

The concave ribs are ornamented,
Figure II, with a row of pearls, decreasing in size from the
front towards the back part of the dish, the back part
of the dish or shell is ornamented with leafwork as shown
in Figure II, one large leaf running towards the middle of the
dish and having a smaller leaf on either side, inclining to the

sides or edges of the disk, the middle or large leaf extending back to the foot as shown in Figure II, - the feet which may be three or more, in number, and on which the base or disk stands are each composed of two scrolls, intersected by a bead - on the back part of the disk, at the stem end of the small leaves the standard or upright is placed, the lower part of which, as seen in Figure I, represents two Dolphins, with their tails twined together forming a knot.

Their heads, in which a bolt is inserted for the purpose of fastening the standard to the disk, by a screw & nut or otherwise, rests on the raised ends of the two small leaves, the upper part of the standard as seen in figure I, is a fluted stem or column, ornamented where it rises from the Dolphins, with two bunches of differently shaped leaves, intersected by a bead and is also ornamented at the top with leaves & beads, below where the Hooks and Handle, are affixed to it.

The Hooks as represented in Figure III, are composed of two scrolls extending in opposite directions from some small leaf work by which they are connected together and attached to the standard.

The Handle is formed of two vines running out of a cluster of leaves, crossing each other & having the ends twisted together in a pendant position in the centre, and ornamented with leaves & a cluster of grapes, and are connected together at the top by an acorn, the shape and ornamenting of the handle are fully shown in the drawing, Figure I, which also shows and represents the stand, complete in a perspective front view.

What I claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent is the design & configuration of the stand as a whole, as fully shown & represented in the

drawing at Figures I. I claim also the particular ornamenting of the shell or dish used as a base, and the configuration and ornamenting of the standard or upright and the design of the Hooks, and the Handle as fully shown and represented in the Drawings at Figures I, II & III, and herein before fully set forth.
