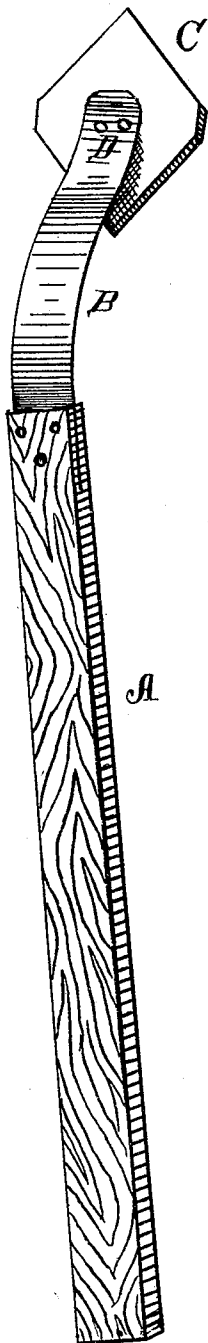
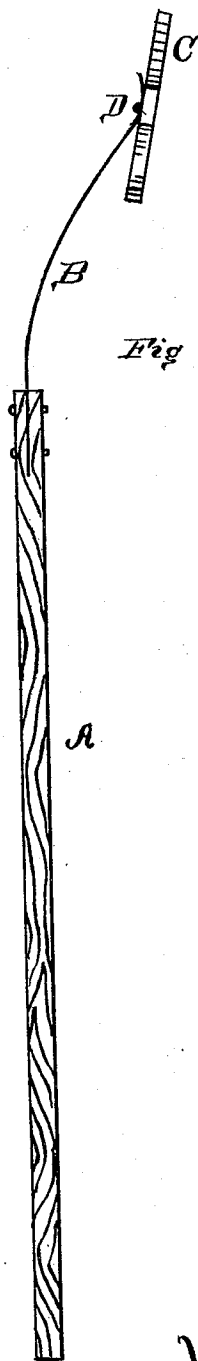

IMPROVEMENT IN LAMP-CHIMNEY CLEANERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 130,307, dated August 6, 1872.

SPECIFICATION.

I, EDWARD P. MORSE, of Batavia, in the county of Genesee and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Device for Cleaning Lamp-Chimneys, of which the following is a specification:

My invention relates to the combination of a spring-arm with a piece of rubber or other elastic substance for the purpose of holding cloth, paper, or other suitable material against the inside of a lamp-chimney or globe when the same is to be cleaned.

I designate my device a chimney-cleaner holder, as the rubber piece does not rub against and clean the glass, but is used in connection with the cloth or paper, and serves to hold and press said cleaning material against the glass.

It will be seen that the rubber in my device does not become soiled by coming in contact with the glass, but a clean piece of cloth or paper can be used each time; also, that I make use of the peculiar power of rubber to adhere to cloth or paper, in holding firmly even a small piece of either while being moved about.

Description of the Accompanying Drawing.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my chimney-cleaner holder. Fig. 2 is a side view of the same.

The same letters refer to like parts in both figures.

A represents the handle; B, the spring-arm; C, the rubber; and D, the rivets or their equivalents connecting the rubber with the spring-arm.

I do not confine myself to the particular means shown for attaching the spring-arm to the handle or to the rubber; but

Having described my invention, what I claim is—

The combination of the handle A, spring-arm B, and rubber C, all constructed substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
