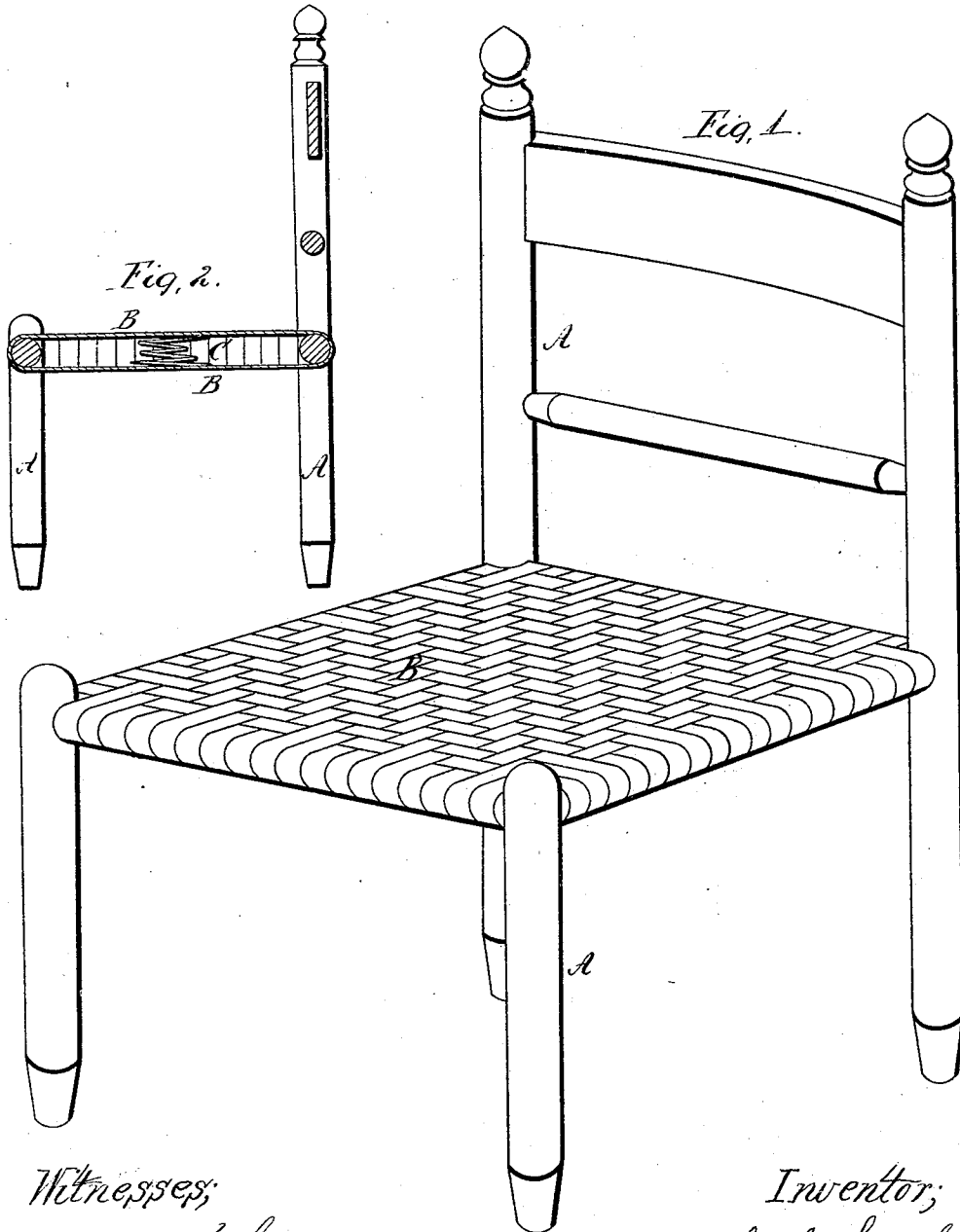

IMPROVED CHAIR-SEAT.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, LEWIS A. SMITH, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, have invented a new and useful Manufacture of Chair-Seats; and I hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a chair-seat embodying my invention.

Figure 2 is a vertical section of the same in combination with a spiral spring.

I form the frame A in the usual manner for a slat or rattan-seated chair, and weave around the same rebons B of sheet iron. For a seat of greater elasticity, I introduce between the upper and lower webs one or more spiral springs C.

I claim herein as new, and of my invention—

A chair-seat formed of metallic strips B, passing continuously around the supporting bars, and woven into two webs as represented.
