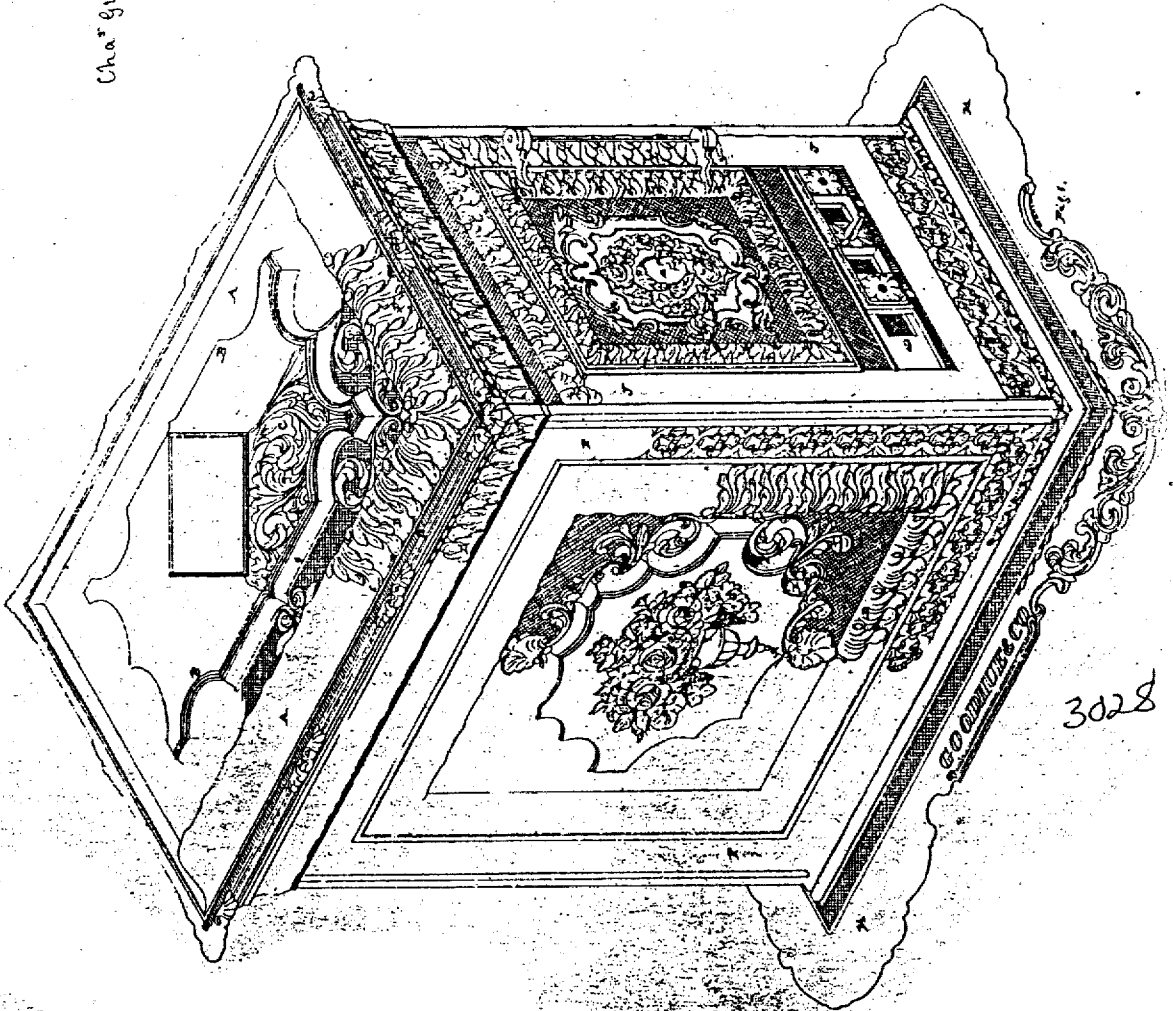
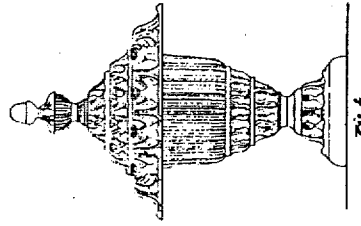

 Letters Patent (Design No. 159) dated 23^d Oct. 1847

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern; Be it known that I, Charles Guild, of Cincinnati, in the County of Hamilton, in the State of Ohio, have invented and produced a new and useful ornamental design for a Parla Stone, with a vase, or urn, to be placed thereon; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which is a full and exact delineation of the same in isometrical perspective.

A, A, fig. 1, is the top plate, which has a raised panel B, B, ornamented with the scroll work leafing, C; the shape or configuration of the panel is such as is represented by the outline thereof. Towards the outer edge of this plate there is an ogee moulding ornamented with the leafing, D, D; without which there is a border E, E.

Fig. 2, represents the vase or urn, which is to stand on the middle of the panel B, B. This vase is rectangular, and has on each of its four sides the respective ornaments, and the configuration shown in the drawing;

F, F, fig. 1, is one of the side plates. This has a raised panel of the configuration represented; and on the panel there is a boquet G, G, for which, however, some other ornament may be substituted, whilst the panel itself and the ornamental borders with the whole configuration thereof may remain otherwise as delineated. H, H, is ornamental scroll work between the panel and the border moulding. The ogee moulding and the leafing D, D, are the same with those represented on the top

plate, Surrounding solid wrought edge moulding is the ornament at border FF, Ff , Along its upper edge this plate is so formed as to constitute an edge moulding having on it the leafing FF

$T, S,$ is one of the end plates having also a panel, on the centre of which there is a winged head surrounded by a wreath of flowers as represented; it has the wrought iron border $T, S,$ and T', S' , and at the bottom the rosettes FF, Ff , similar to those so marked in the side plate, as is also its upper ornament $I, I,$

This plate as shown has in it a door, the opposite end is similar to that represented but is without a door.

$M, M,$ is the bottom plate, the outer edge only of which is seen, and this has the configuration and ornaments as delineated.

Fig. 3. is one of the legs with the leafing and other wrought work as represented.

Having thus fully described the shape or configuration of the respective plates of my Stone with the ornaments thereon, and also of the vase to be placed thereon, and the leg by which it is supported, I hereby claim the said individual plates, the vase and the leg, when made in configuration, and in ornament, substantially as herein designated.
