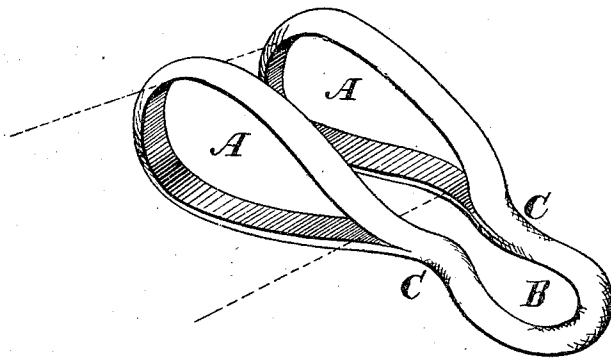
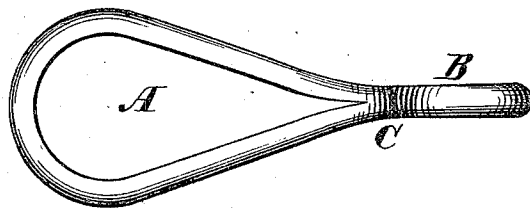

IMPROVEMENT IN WHIFFLETREE-CLIPS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 128,720, dated July 9, 1872.

I, STANTON J. FOREMAN, of Nottawa, (post-office, Mendon,) county of St. Joseph, State of Michigan, have invented certain Improvements in Whiffletree-Clips, of which the following is a specification:

Nature and object of the invention consist in the construction of a whiffletree-clip of iron, in such a shape as will not rot the wood by retaining the moisture under the iron, as in the old style; and will also give more strength to the whiffletree, and a device much cheaper made, and fitting to any size whiffletree by closing it down on the same.

Description of Accompanying Drawing.

Figure 1 perspective view. Fig. 2 side elevation.

General Description.

Like letters indicate like parts.

A A is the loop in which the wood of the whiffletree is inserted. B is the loop where the clevis is inserted. C C is crook to prevent the clevis from wearing the wood of the whiffletree.

Claim.

I claim as my invention—

The whiffletree-clip having the loops A A and B, and the curved parts C C, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
