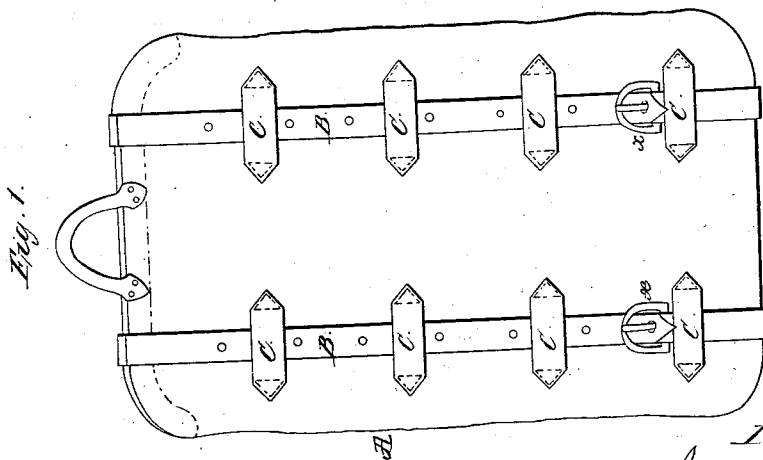
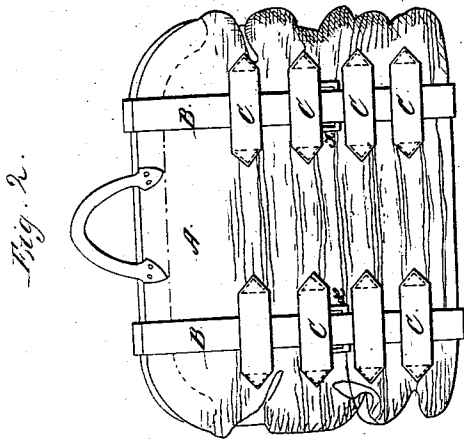

IMPROVED CARPET-SACK.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, ADALINE ROSE, of Bath, in the county of Steuben, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful improvements in "Carpet-Sacks;" and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon.

In the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, A represents a carpet-sack, which is of leather, carpeting, or other suitable material, and somewhat longer than the ordinary sacks. At each side of the handles, and extending from the mouth to the bottom of the sack, on each side of the carpet-sack, are leather straps, B B, which are held in their places by keepers, C. Near the bottom of the straps B are buckles, x x, which connect the two ends of the straps, as will be hereinafter set forth.

The object of my invention is the construction of a carpet-sack which may be used for a larger or smaller amount of clothing. It will be seen that the straps are provided with a series of openings through which the buckle-pin passes, so as to connect the two ends of the said straps for the purpose of drawing the carpet-sack together, (as shown in Figure 2,) to be used for a smaller or larger amount of clothing.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The carpet-sack A provided with the straps B and buckles, and with the keepers C, as and for the purpose specified.
