

DESIGN FOR WOVEN FABRIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,615, dated April 13, 1886.

Application filed January 7, 1886. Serial No. 187,924. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES R. MACCOLL, of Pawtucket, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Woven Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

Reference is to be had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification, 10 and which illustrates my design.

The leading feature of my design consists in a fabric ornamented by squares bounded on all sides by a series of parallel strands crossing each other at the corners of the squares and interrupted or concealed at points between their 15 points of intersection.

I claim—

The design for fabrics herein shown and described, the same consisting in the fabric ornamented by a series of rectangular fields 20 filled with small squares, the said fields being bounded on each of their sides by a series of plain parallel strands which cross each other at the corners of the fields, and are partially concealed or interrupted at regular intervals 25 between their points of intersection.
