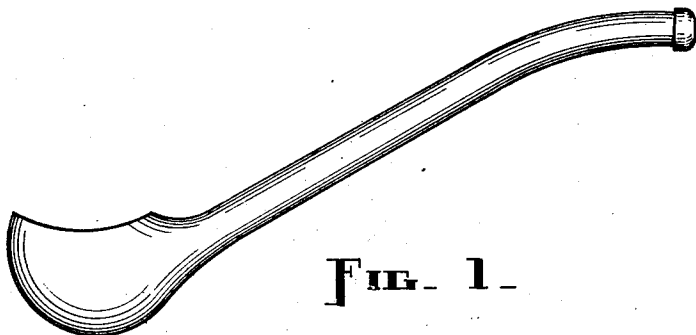

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALBERT S. HILLS, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Haydenville, in the county of Hampshire and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Drinking-Pipes, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

In the drawings, Figure 1 is a side elevation of a drinking pipe, showing my new design, and Fig. 2 is a top plan of the same.
