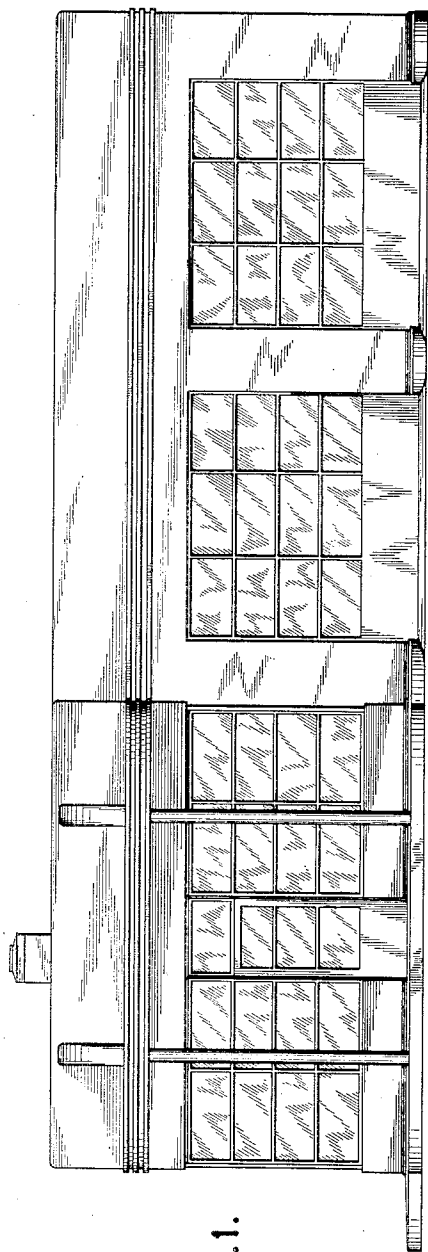

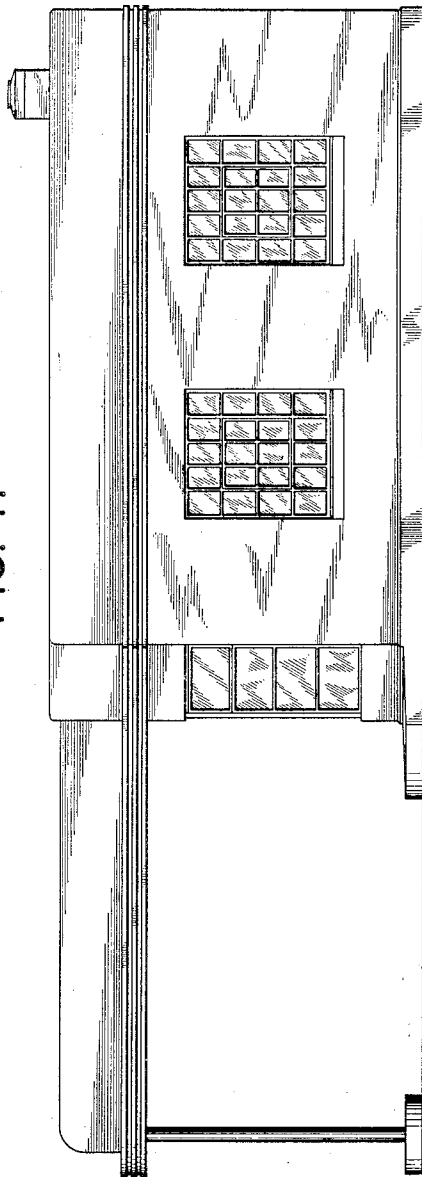
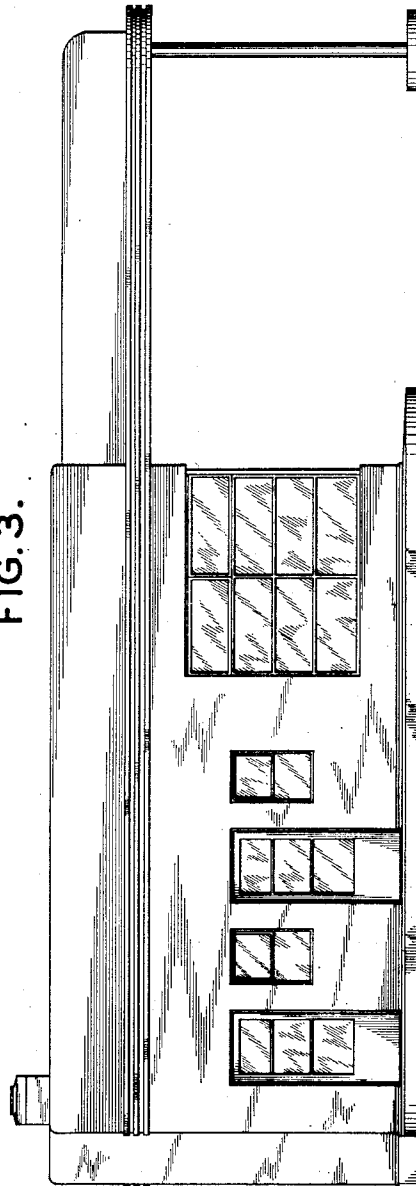

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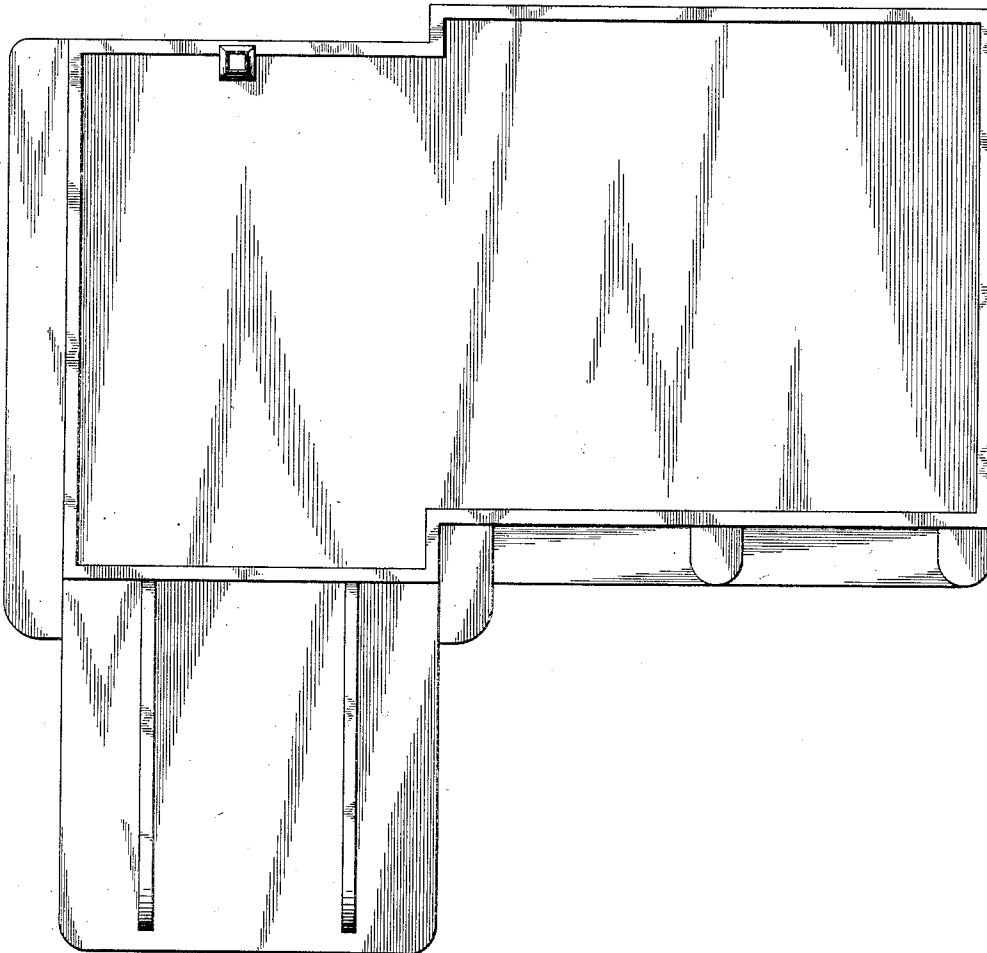

## DESIGN FOR A SERVICE STATION

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, Walter D. Teague, a citizen of the United States, residing at Forest Hills, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Service Station of which the following is a specification, reference having been had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof, in which:—

Fig. 1 is a view in front elevation of a service station embodying my design.

Fig. 2 is a view in rear elevation of the same service station shown in Fig. 1.

Fig. 3 is a view in end elevation of the same service station as viewed from the left in Fig. 1.

Fig. 4 is a view in end elevation of the same service station as viewed from the right in Fig. 1, and

Fig. 5 is a top plan view of the same station.
