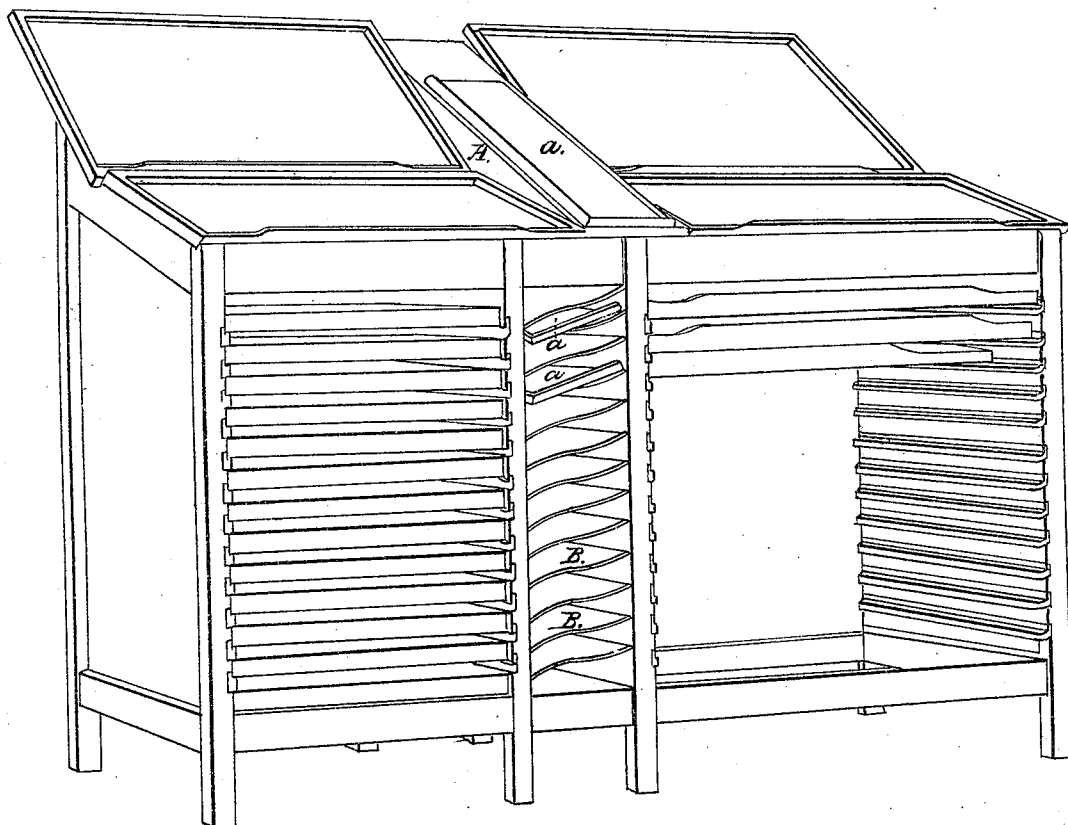

## IMPROVEMENT IN CASE-STANDS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

I, ALEXANDER T. DEPUY, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Printers' Cabinets, of which the following is a specification.

### *Nature and Objects of the Invention.*

My invention relates to printers' cabinets, and consists in a novel manner of constructing them to render them more convenient to the compositor, and facilitate the operation of "setting up," as will be fully set forth hereafter.

The drawing accompanying this specification represents a perspective view of my improved cabinet.

### *General Description.*

The cabinet is constructed of the ordinary form, except that between the two sets of cases on the top, an inclined rest, A, is arranged, to support the galley *a*, and between the rows of trays beneath, a series of inclined shelves, B, is placed, to hold the galleys when filled.

The galleys are thus always close at hand, and con-

venient to the compositor, who is not obliged to leave the case to deposit the contents of his "stick" in the galley; and the galleys, when filled, are held by the inclined shelves in such position that there is no danger of the lines of type being knocked out of place or otherwise deranged.

### *Claims.*

What I claim as my invention is—

1. The combination and arrangement, with the cabinet, of the galley-chamber B, provided with inclined shelves to hold the galleys *a*, substantially in the manner and for the purpose herein described and specified.

2. The combination and arrangement, with the cases, of the galley-rest A, constructed substantially as herein described and set forth.
