



DESIGN FOR CASING FOR MOTION-PICTURE PROJECTORS.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, GERALD J. BADGLEY, a citizen of the United States, residing at Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Casing for Motion-Picture Projectors, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, in which—
