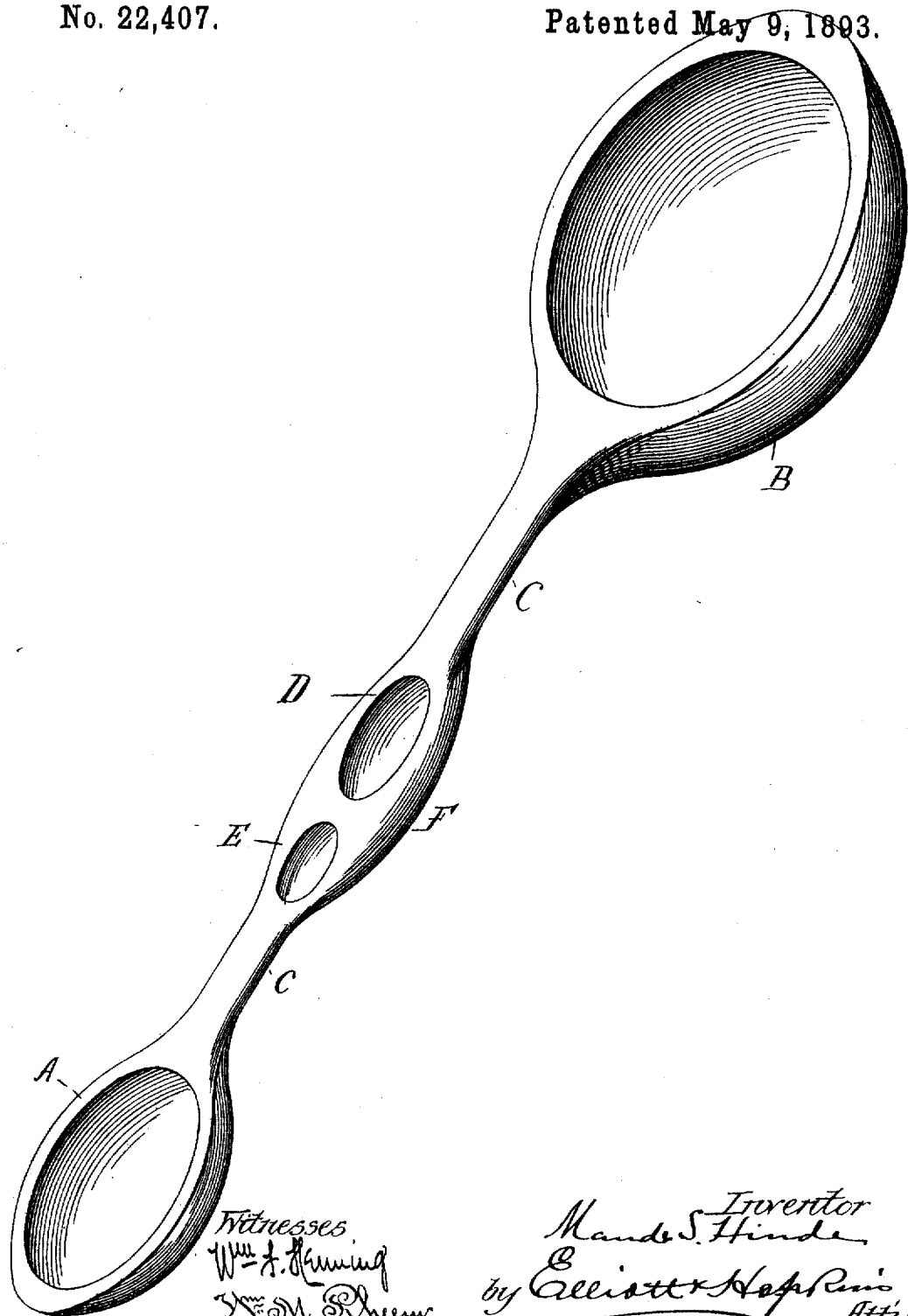

DESIGN FOR A SPOON, &c.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 22,407, dated May 9, 1893.

Application filed January 25, 1893. Serial No. 459,737. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MAUD S. HINDE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois,
5 have invented and produced a new and original Design for Spoons or Culinary Utensils, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which shows my design in perspective.

10 The leading features of my design consist of two bowls arranged one near each end of an intermediate or connecting handle. The said bowls are shown at A, B, and they are of
15 different sizes each bearing substantially the same relation to the said intermediate handle which is shown at C, as an ordinary spoon bowl or ladle bears to its handle.

Arranged or formed in the handle intermediate of the bowls A, B, and at a point remote 20 from said bowls, are two other bowls or cavities D, E. These latter are smaller than either of the bowls A, B, and they also differ in size with each other. The intermediate bowls D, E, are formed in an enlarged rounded portion 25 F of the handle C, and are substantially in line with the handle and the other bowls.

Having thus described my design, what I claim is—

The design for spoons or culinary utensils, 30 substantially as herein shown and described.
