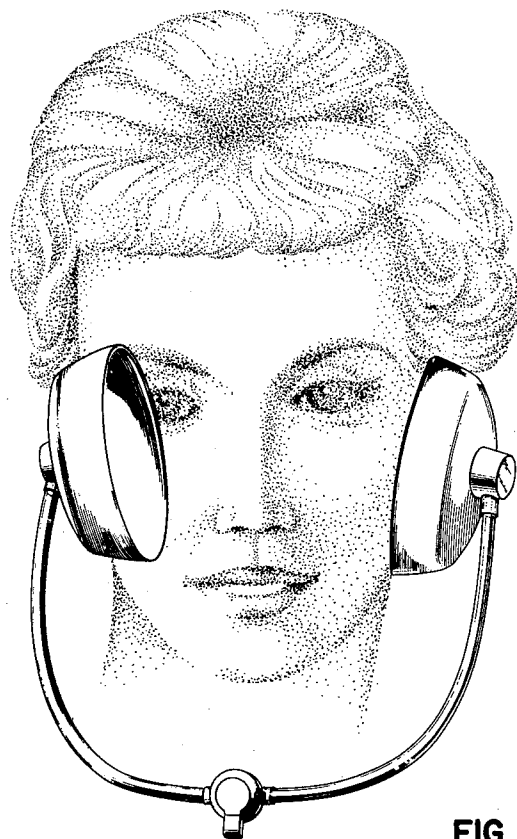

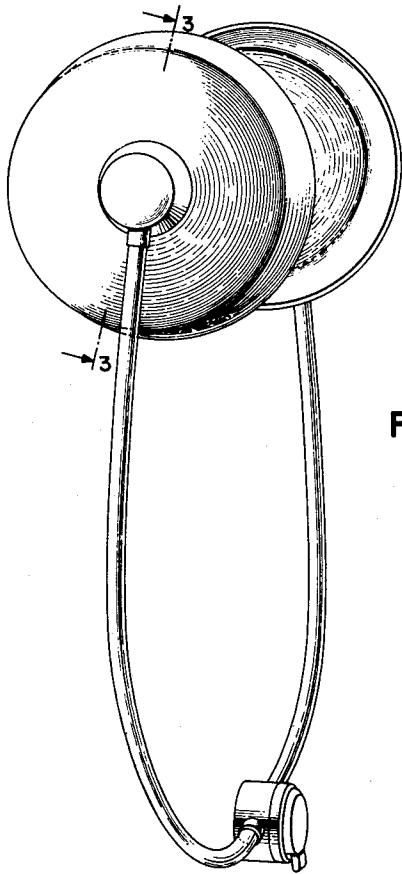

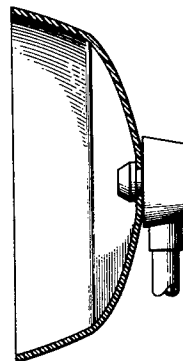

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a listening device showing our new design, with an individual's head in phantom to illustrate the manner in which the listening device is intended to be used.

FIG. 2 is a side perspective view of the same.

FIG. 3 is a fragmentary side elevational view thereof, partly in cross-section through the earcup on line 3—3 in FIG. 2.

The dominant feature of our new design is an under-the-chin yoke comprising a signal receiving element and depending therefrom hollow tubes for conducting sound to and supporting a pair of earcups.
