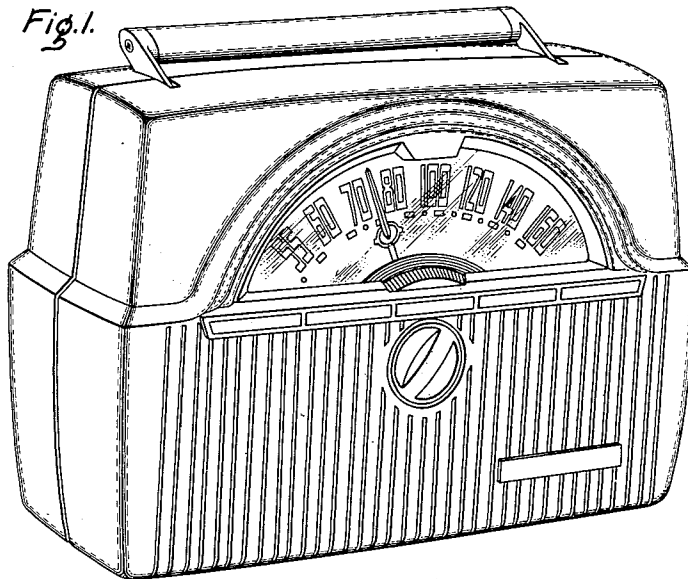

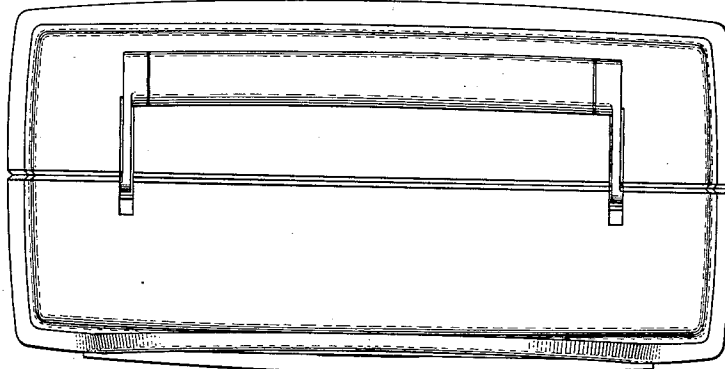
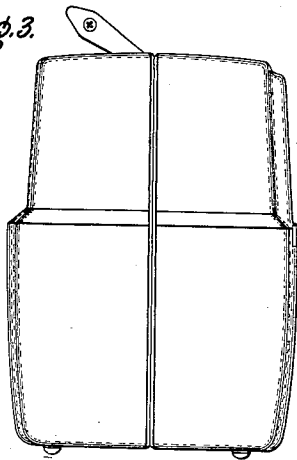

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, George A. Beck, a citizen of the United States, residing at Manlius, State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Radio Receiver, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part hereof.

Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a radio receiver embodying my new design,

Fig. 2 is a top plan view thereof, and

Fig. 3 is an end elevational view, the opposite end being similar.
